CRITFC's mission is to coordinate the efforts of the four Commission member tribes (Warm Springs, Umatilla, Yakama, and Nez Perce) to restore salmon to the Columbia River Basin, and to uphold the treaty rights of these sovereign nations. We seek a dynamic leader to serve as Executive Director of the Commission. Through a staff of approximately 85 employees, and at the direction of the Commission, the Executive Director initiates strategies and manages all activities of the finance, administrative, research and development, legal, and law enforcement functions; develops and recommends programs designed to meet the Commission goals; implements policies and procedures approved by the Commission; and serves as a highly visible spokesperson for the Commission and its member tribes.

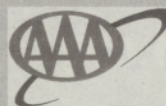
