Commemorates Chicago Fire

Fire Prevention Week commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, the two-day blaze that killed more

than 250 people, left 100,000 people homeless, and destroyed more than 17,000 buildings.

The tragedy inspired reform across America, spurring new fire safety codes and public awareness campaigns.

Each October, the National Fire Protection Association sponsors a fire prevention campaign to highlight the importance of fire safety education.

This year's theme focuses on preventing fires in the home – where people spend most of their time, and where 80 percent of U.S. fire deaths occur.

Fire facts

The leading causes of fires in the home are cooking, heating equipment, and electrical.

Fires caused by smoking materials and heating equipment are the leading cause of home fire deaths.

In a recent year, fire departments in the U.S. responded to 400,000 home structure fires.

Home fires in the recent year killed 2,580 people.

Sixty-five percent of home fire deaths occurred in homes with either no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

December and January are the peak months for home structure fires and deaths.
