Now, the products can be tested at the Composite Products plant before being sent off for certification testing. There are savings in not having to over-engineer, or pay for multiple certification testings.

Tectonite is used to make the fire-rated doors. The door is assembled at the plant, with some parts shipped in from other plants. Once assembled, the door can be covered with a wood veneer of any kind of wood.

This gives architects freedom in their designs, making these doors highly desirable in the marketplace, said Coochise.

Composite Products also has patented processes involving the use of intumescent materials, which swell when exposed to heat.

These materials are used to create fire-rated wood doorframes that can be matched with architectural fire doors. Composite Products is a lead-

ing innovator in meeting these types of construction needs.

### Diversity of products

Besides the fire-rated materials used in building, Composite Products also has a division that develops bulletproofing materials.

The material is used in vehicles and buildings, usually military, where bulletproofing is needed.

Composite Products recently combined technologies to create unique fire-rated and bulletproof doors. The company is believed to be the only one in the U.S. to have successfully combined the two technologies.

Composite Products has a thriving business in specialized wood products, specifically a product called "squiggle," which is used for installing corrugated PVC roofing and sold through home improvement stores such as Lowes and Home Depot.

The squiggle plant used wood from the mill that other-

wise was considered scrap wood.

### Business of the year

Composite Products is governed by a board of directors that includes Robert Macy, chairman, Richard Craig, Mavis Shaw, Paiute Chief Joe Moses, and Gerald Smith.

Over the years, Composite Products has received recognition from several organizations.

The U.S. Department of Commerce awarded the enterprise an Export Achievement Certificate "for accomplishments in the global market place."

A few years ago, the U.S. Small Business Administration Portland District Office named Composite Products the Minority Small Business of the Year.

Most recently, the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce named Warm Springs Composite Products one of two Businesses of the Year in the county.
