## Candidate for County Commission

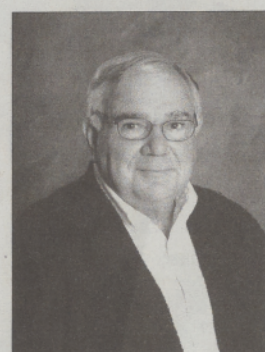
To the citizens of Warm Springs,
