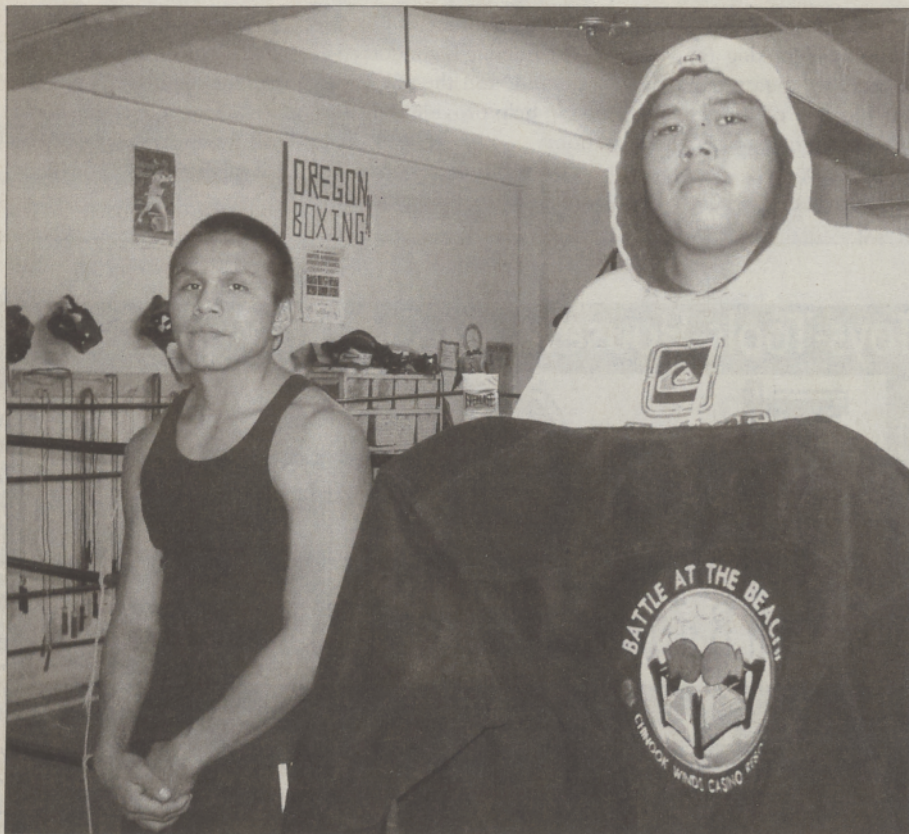


Smith, Johnson win at beach
