Resource team approves timber, other projects

The Resource Management Interdisciplinary Team on February 10 approved decision documents for the 2010 and 2011 timber sales, along with two small project assessments (SPAs), one to expand fiber optic capabilities and another to rock a portion of Charley Canyon Road.

The team (RMIDT) unanimously passed a resolution to approve a decision document for the Upper Beaver Creek 2010 Timber Sale.

A project assessment, evaluating the sale's impacts, had already been released for tribal member comment and after a 30-day review the project was approved as recommended by the technical staff from Natural Resources and Forestry.

The Upper Beaver Creek 2010 Timber Sale will target a harvest volume of approximately 27 million board feet of timber. The treatment area is just under 2,500 acres in size.

RMIDT unanimously passed a resolution to approve a decision document for the Upper Warm Springs 2011 Timber Sale, as well.

This sale will target a harvest volume of approximately 37.5 million board feet of timber and cover an area just under 1,800 acres in size.

Maps and assessments of both timber sales are available through the Forestry Branch office.

A project approved by RMIDT under the SPA process will allow Eagle-Tech Systems

to expand the tribal fiber network.

Fiber optic cable will now go to the new media center, Tribal Construction, Natural Resources and Forestry branches, BIA Roads, and BIA Facilities Management.

A second SPA to rock approximately two miles of Charley Canyon Road was also approved by RMIDT.
