## Answer to the Geo-history quiz

The geo-history question in the previous Spilyay asked about the location of this site on the reservation.

The answer: The photograph shows the longhouse that used to stand on the Queahpama ranch property in the Simnasho area.

The property is located along Highway 3 between Simnasho and Kah-Nee-Ta Resort.

Years ago, the longhouse was torn down and a new one was built at HeHe, said Faye Waheneka, tribal elder.

As a child, Waheneka used to go to the longhouse shown in the picture.

At the time, the Simnasho area was home to many farming families, she said.

Many of the people attended the church that still stands at Simnasho. An interpreter would translate the sermons, because some of

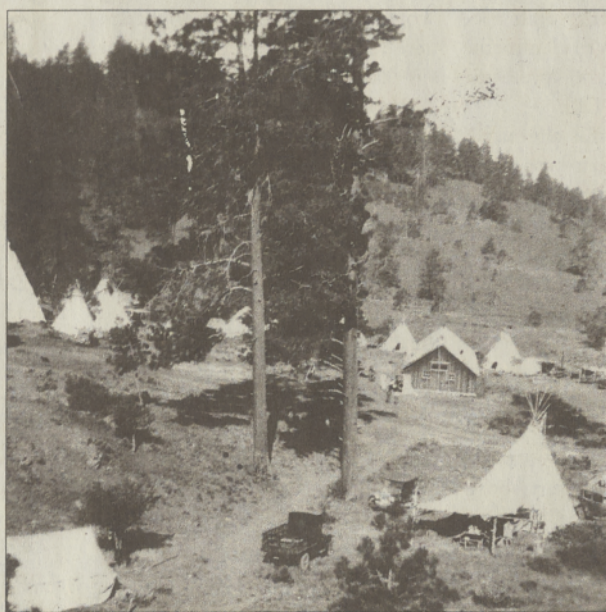

the people who attended spoke only the Native language. In those days Simnasho had a

baseball team that traveled around the region for games, said Waheneka.
