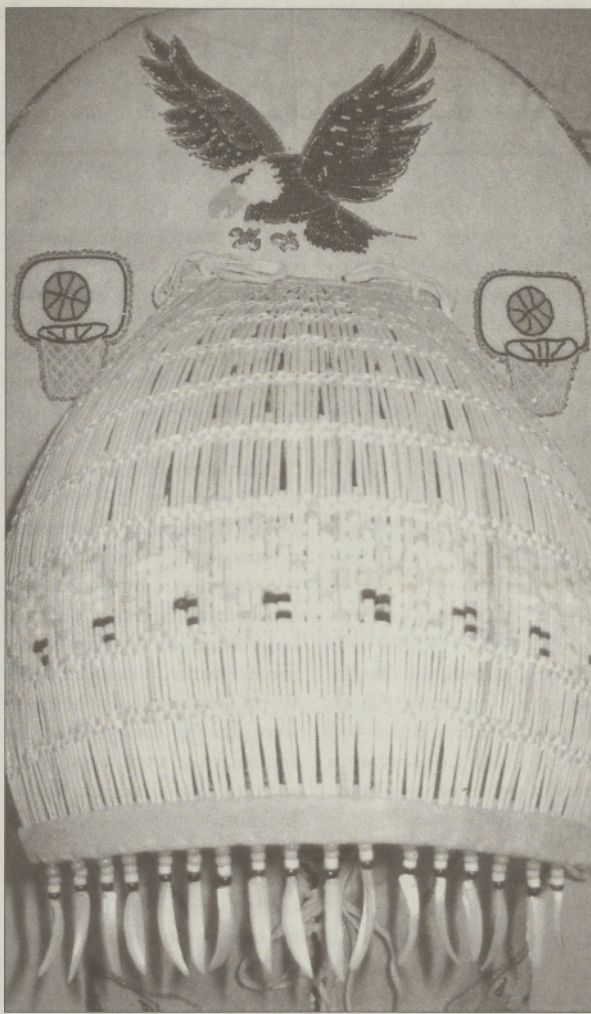
The baby boards will be at the museum Changing Exhibits Gallery through May 25. Examples include:

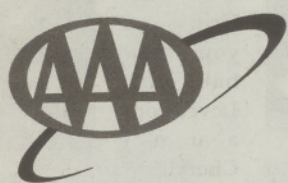

Raffle tickets are one for \$1; or six for \$5.

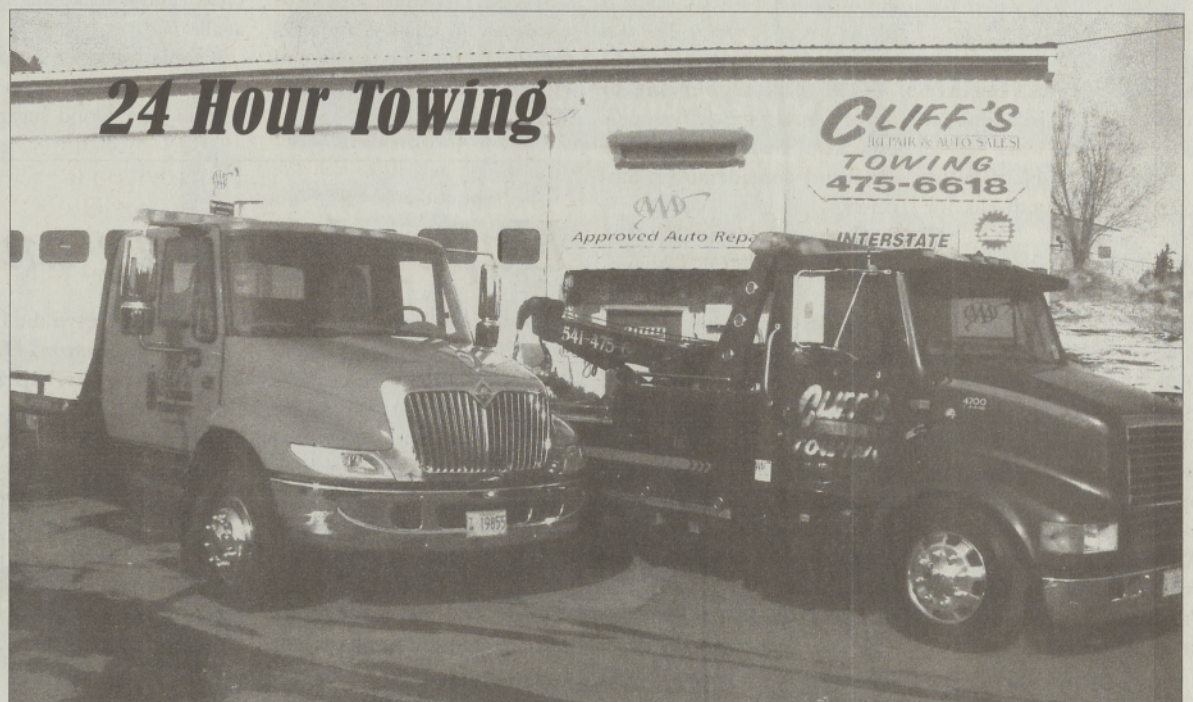
