

Wreck injures seven, one seriously

Seven people, including five tribal members, were injured in a motor vehicle accident on Highway 97 near Madras.

Aldwin G. Keo, 20, from Eugene, was badly injured in the accident. He suffered a severely broken leg, and was hospitalized at St. Charles Medical Center-Redmond.

Keo was driving a 2001 Pontiac that was struck head-

on by an on-coming pickup truck, driving by a Bellingham, Wash., man.

The driver of the truck, William Bunton, crossed the center line and struck Keo's vehicle, according to police.

Bunton was apparently looking down at his gas gauge and drifted over the line, police said. The accident happened on May 23 on the highway near Hall Road.

Also injured in the accident, were Keo's passengers Jeremiah Smith, 19, Luther Keo, 17, Andre Thomas, 16, and James Keo, 19. They were treated for injuries and released from the hospital.

The emergency response crew had to use the jaws-of-life device to extract the driver and passengers of the Pontiac.

8:15 a.m. and post time is 8:30 a.m.

The start and finish line is near the Shaker Church on Shitike Creek Road—signs will be posted.

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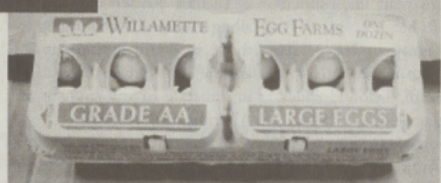


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
