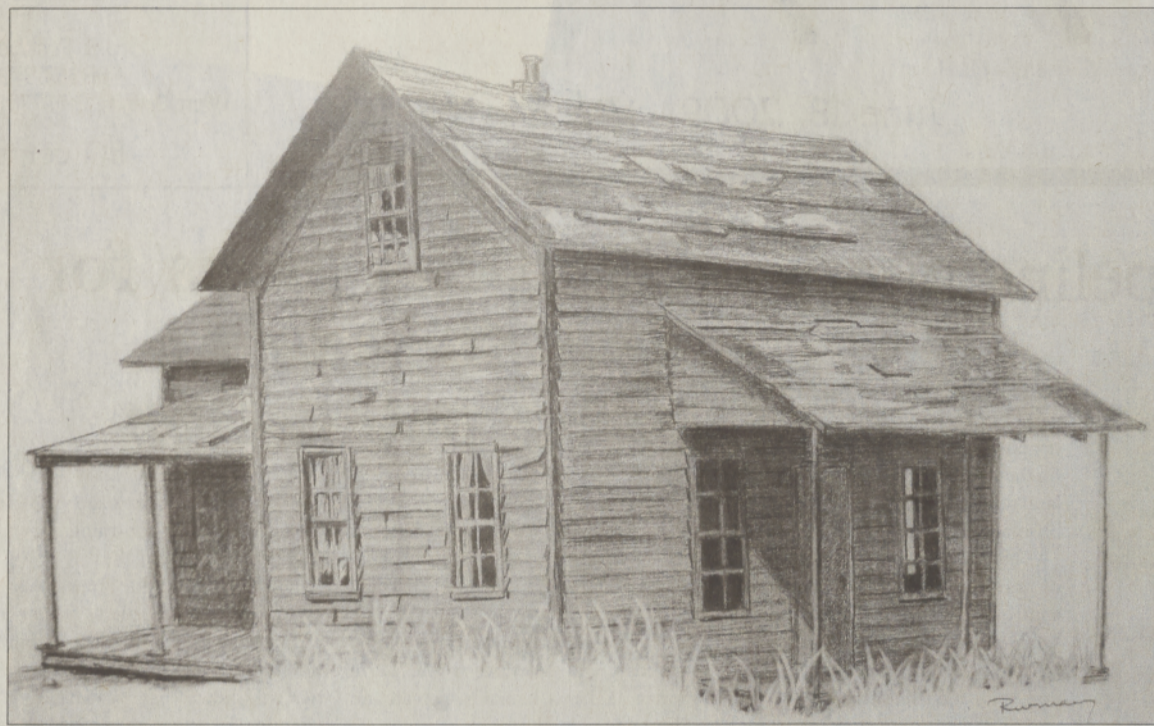


Drawing depicts Billy Chinook home



This Richard Macy drawing shows the house where Billy Chinook lived on the reservation.

Among the historical drawings by artist Richard Macy is the house on the reservation where Billy Chinook once lived.

The house is no longer there, though remnants remain at the site on Miller Flat.

Macy used an old photograph of the building to

make the drawing. Historian and author George Aguilar first showed the photo to Macy.

The photograph is small and dark, and Macy had to use a magnifying glass to better see the details and recreate them.

Macy was inspired to make the drawing, because Billy Chinook is his great great grandfather.

Billy Chinook, or William Parker, lived on the reservation later in his life, after the tribes and the U.S. government signed the Treaty of 1855, which Parker helped to negotiate on behalf of the tribes.

As a young man, Billy lived at The Dalles. He later traveled with the Frémont expedition in the 1840s to California.

He lived for a time in Washington, D.C., and in Philadelphia. He then moved back to California, and then returned to The Dalles, where he became an advocate of his Wasco people.

After the treaty, Billy was relocated to the reservation, where he lived on Miller Flat until his passing in 1890.
