

OSU president, staff visiting Warm Springs

The Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs signed a revised Memorandum of Understanding Oregon State University on the OSU campus in April of this year.

In reciprocation of Tribal Council's visit to OSU, the tribes have invited the OSU president, Ed Ray, provost Sebah Sandhawa, and a delegation of 13 other faculty and staff with particular expertise in topics of interest to the tribes to visit Warm Springs.

During the upcoming visit, the tribes and OSU staff will have detailed discussions about how the university and the tribes can work together to further the economic development, natural resources, health and other interests of the tribes.

The OSU delegation will be in Warm Springs on Monday, July 6 and Tuesday, July 7. There will be a dinner with the OSU delegates, open to the public, on Monday evening, July 6 at the Agency Longhouse.

The dinner will be a chance for the tribal membership to meet the OSU president and staff, learn what OSU has to offer students from Warm Springs, and hear what OSU has done for former students.

During the visit, there will be all-day tours and action planning. This is more than a ceremonial visit, said secretary-treasurer Jody Calica.

"We expect specific planning will be done in small strategic teams of OSU and tribal repre-

sentatives that will lead to concrete actions," said Calica.

Tribal Natural Resources, small Business and economic development, student services, library and records management, and health care are among the topics and mini-tours planned for the OSU visit.
