

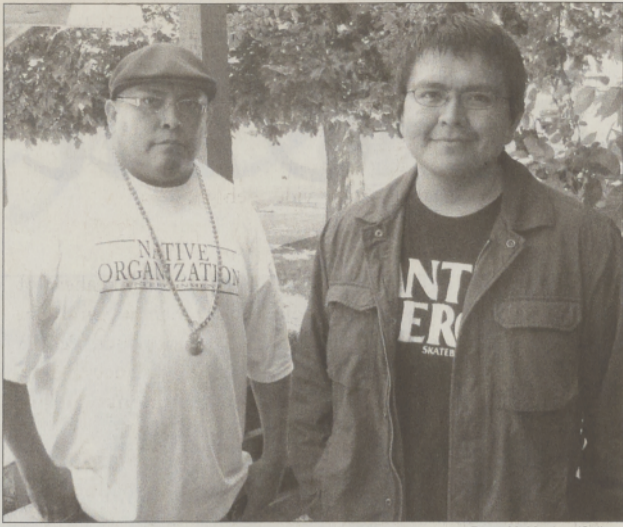
# Filmmaker visits Warm Springs for video project

Filmmaker Dustin Craig and his sound man Gene Declay were in Warm Springs recently, working on a law enforcement training video.

Craig is an independent film producer. He directed the *Geronimo* episode of the PBS series *We Shall Remain*.

In Warm Springs he interviewed Nola Queahpama and Lucinda Green about tribal cultural traditions.

The information from these and other interviews will be shared in the training video with law enforcement officers and investigators, such as the FBI.

New officers hired to work in Warm Springs could also benefit from the video.

Officers need to be aware of tribal traditions during their response to criminal cases on the reservation, said Sammy Bruised Head, of Victims of Crime Services.

Bruised Head assisted Craig and Declay while they were in Warm Springs.

Nola Queahpama and Lucinda Green were chosen for the Warm Springs interviews because of their experience in advocacy and cultural knowledge, said Bruised Head.

Besides the Warm Springs

tribal members, the filmmakers interviewed Indians from Choctaw, Miss., Pine Ridge, South Dakota, and Barrow, Alaska.

The video is being produced for Unified Solutions, and will be about 30 minutes in length.

The issue being addressed happens when law enforcement is called in to investigate a major crime such as homicide on the reservation.

The goal is for the officers to be aware of the cultural practices while pursuing the investigation.

## More fire safety tips

Smokey Bear says please talk to your kids about fireworks and safety.

The Fourth of July is near, and that means parades, barbecues, family get-togethers and of course fireworks.

Before all the celebrating begins, please read and follow these safety rules that Smokey Bear and Fire Management would like everyone in the community to follow:

Be prepared... before you light fireworks.

Purchase only legal fireworks, available at licensed firework stands. Ensure the safety of pets.

Keep a bucket of water handy in which to place all used fireworks. Have a water hose or fire extinguisher nearby to put out stray sparks.

Be safe... when lighting fireworks:

Have an adult light all fireworks. Light one firework at a time. Use fireworks only outdoors, away from anything that can burn.

Be responsible... after you finish:

Be considerate of neighbors. Clean up all debris when finished. If a firework does not light or fire, an adult should wait at least 15 minutes and approach it carefully.

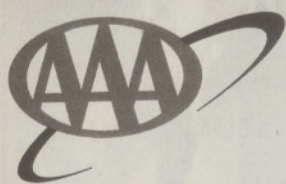
Make sure all unused fireworks, matches and lighters are out of sight and reach of children.
