Public Safety General Manager.

Work under the Chief Operations Officer as Public Safety General Manager. Plan, organize, direct, and control the functions of the Public Safety Branch. Develop and implement policies, procedures, rules, regulations and law ordinances to protect life and property through the judicial process and crime prevention work. Provide law enforcement and judicial programs within the Public Safety Services to the community. Responsible for maintaining positive public relations. Assure quality of services to the com-

Exclusion order

Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, plaintiff, vs. Christina Yambao, defendant. Case no. CV89-09.

It is hereby ordered and adjudged that the defendant is excluded for two years from the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. Compliance with this exclusion order may be enforced by the contempt power of the tribal court in accordance with chapter 200 of the Warm Springs Tribal Code. If the defendant is found on the reservation in violation of this exclusion order the court may impose

jail, fine or both for contempt of court, in addition to violations of the Warm Springs Tribal Code Chapter 300, the tribal exclusion code.

Hearings

To the people named in the following cases:

All of the facts of the case will be heard at this hearing, including evidence you wish to present. You must appear to present your argument or the other side will automatically win. The petitioner may then be given all that is asked for in the petition for conservator/guardian.

The petitioner will be present at the hearing. If you desire to personally argue your side of the case, you may have a legal aide, spokesperson or attorney appear on your behalf at your expense. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

You are ordered to be and appear at the Warm Springs Tribal Court at the time and date shown, to **show cause** why the exclusion orders should not be reinstated for repetitive police contact/detox. This hearing will not be a full hearing on the merits of the case; you must appear and de-

fend against a complaint that you failed to obey the order of the court. If you fail to appear as so ordered, the tribal court shall enter a complaint for contempt of court and issue a warrant for your arrest. If you have any questions, you should seek legal advice immediately.

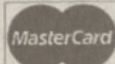
