Robert (Hood) Harry McCormack, 1950-2009

Robert (Hood) Harry McCormack of Lapwai, Idaho, passed away Tuesday, Sept. 1, 2009 at Deaconess Medical Center in Spokane from congenital heart failure and respiratory illness.

Born May 19, 1950, the youngest son of Harry (Fox) Pete McCormack and Mary Sarah Ellenwood McCormack at St. Joseph's Hospital in Lewiston, Hood was a member of the Nez Perce Tribe, Wallowa Band descendants. He attended school in and graduated from the Lapwai school system, and went on to Haskell Indian Junior College in Lawrence, Kan., where he graduated with an associate's degree in 1973.

Hood was a gifted athlete in Lapwai, playing basketball, football, baseball and running track for the school and

recreational programs. He received All American honors for football his junior and senior years, and continue on with his football career at Haskell, where he received All American honors as well. As part of the Nez Perce Athletic Association and AAU boxing, he also received two Golden Glove awards.

Hood was most at home and had a love for being outdoors, fishing on the Columbia River and Rapid River and hunting in the mountains in Idaho and Oregon with his family and friends. He was a member of the Nez Perce Nation basketball team who originally was coached by his father, Harry (Fox) Pete McCormack.

Hood is survived by three daughters, Angela I. McCormack of Lapwai, Mystina Shante and Saralee Lorette Spino-McCormack of Warm Springs; one son, Harry

Pete McCormack of Jacksonville, Fla.; two granddaughters, Lorena Teegan and Annelia Charee Tucker of Lapwai; five sisters, Veronica Mae Taylor, Loretta (Chet) Halfmoon, Shirley (Shell) McCormack, Ethel Greene and Geraldine (Geri) Jackson, all of Lapwai; two brothers, Joseph (Esky) McCormack of Lapwai and Jimmy McCormack of Winchester; and many nieces, nephews and cousins whom he loved.

Hood was preceded in death by his parents, Harry Pete and Mary Sarah McCormack; brothers Mickey Lee McCormack, Rudy McCormack and Melvin McCormack; sister Vera Ann Tuell; and grandson Baby Boy McCormack-Tucker.



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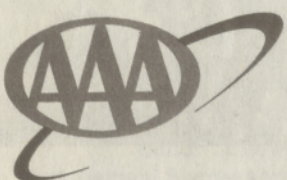
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
