The Foundation's five-year strategic goals are to:

Support Native arts and cultural revitalization.

Facilitate the growth of Native arts and cultures and their

potential to contribute to healthy change in our neighborhoods, communities, and country.

Connect Native arts and cultures into other sectors of society.

Stimulate new philanthropy to support Native arts and cultures.

The Program Director is a key, senior staff position, responsible for designing and implementing NACF's grantmaking program in furtherance of this mission and these goals. In 2010, NACF will make its first round of grants. The Program Director will have to work closely with the President/CEO and others to create and implement a granting program that is operational in 2010.

Responsibilities:
