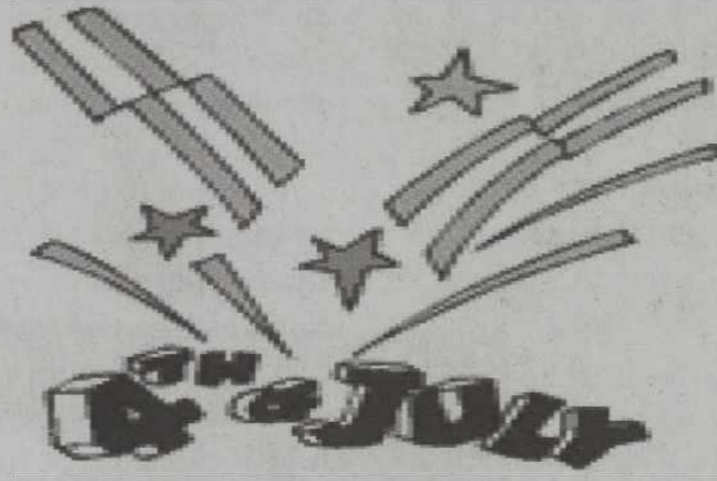

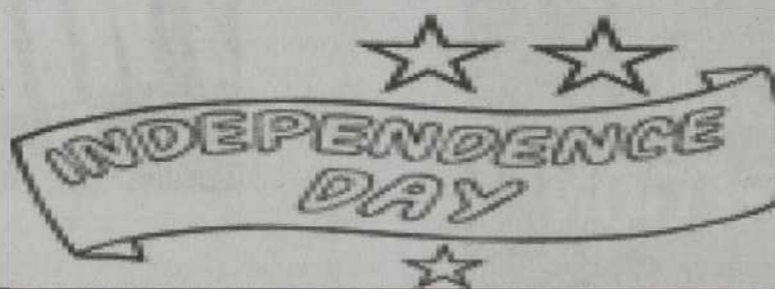

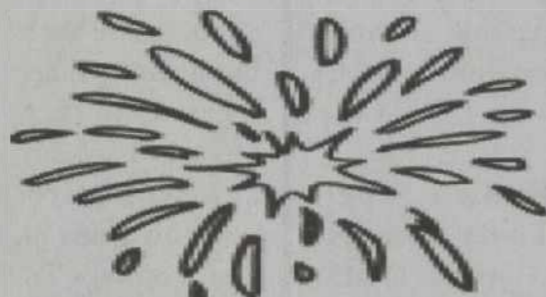
We celebrate all day, in the morning we
