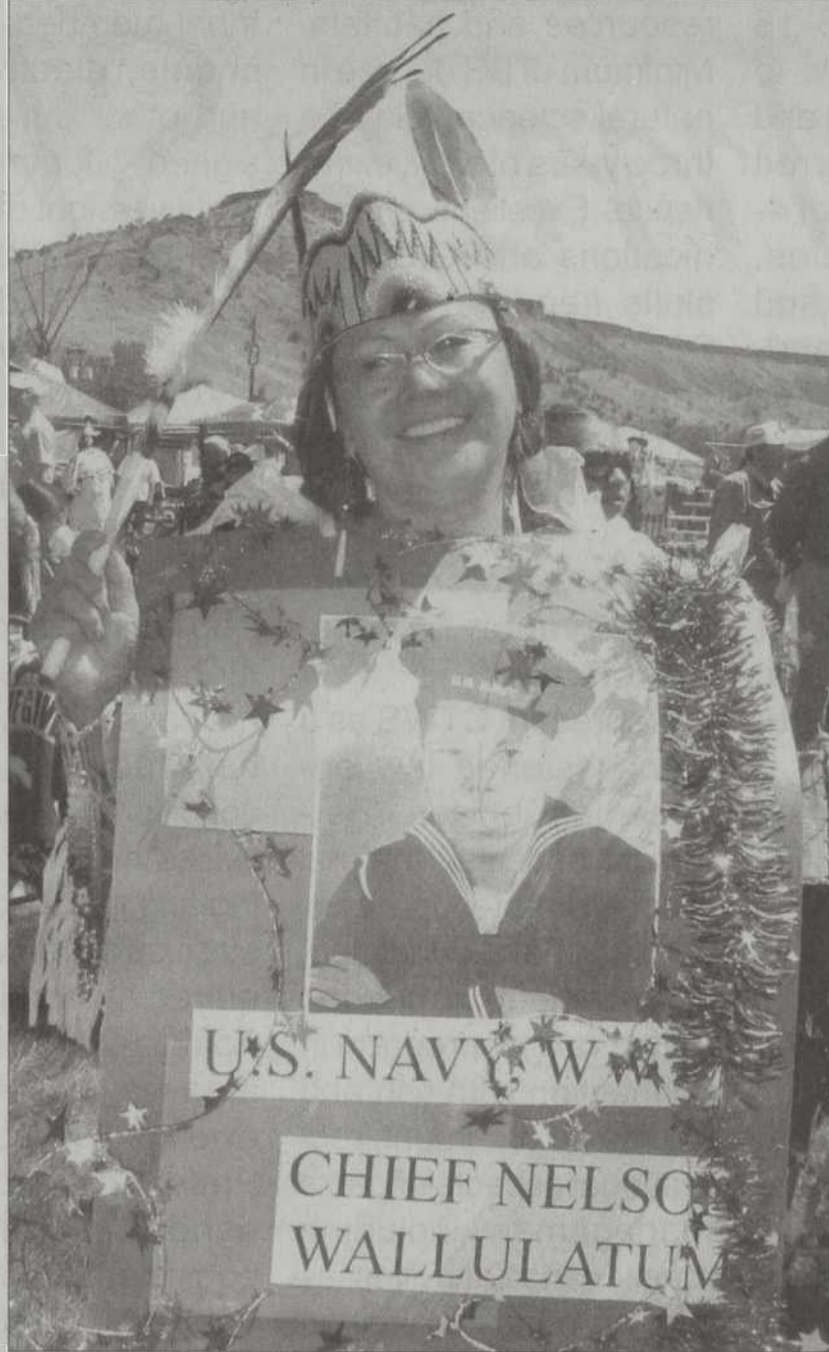

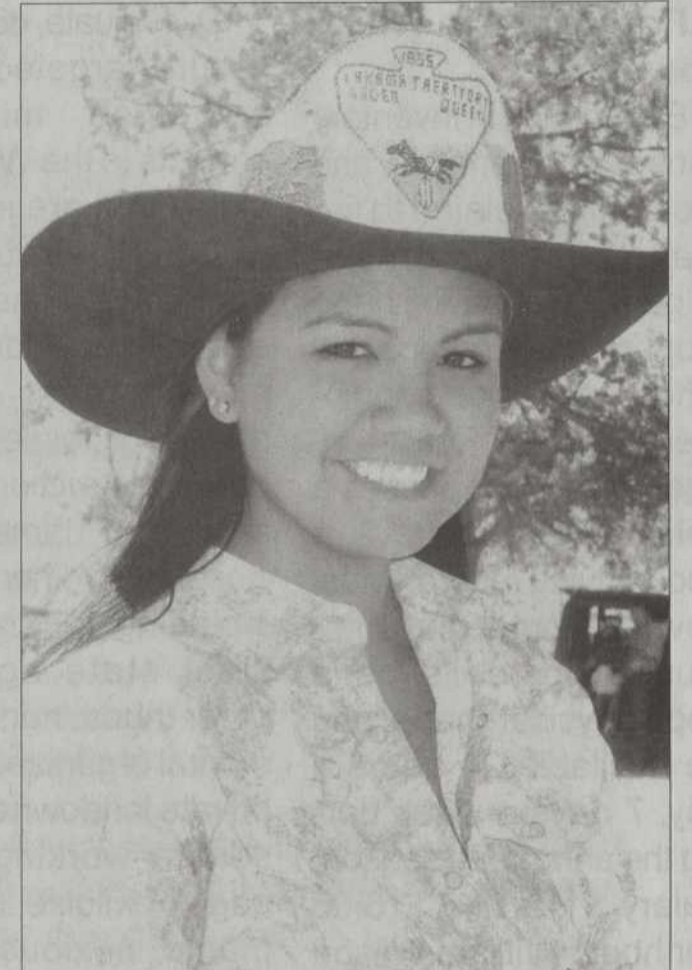

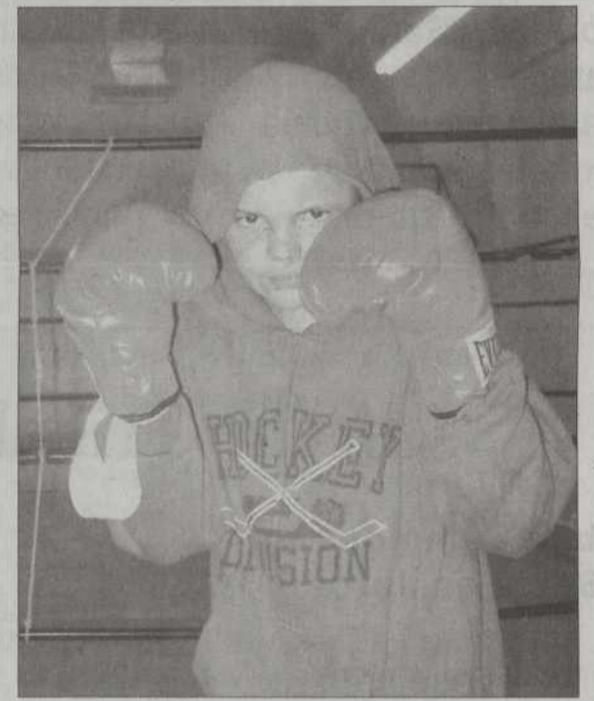

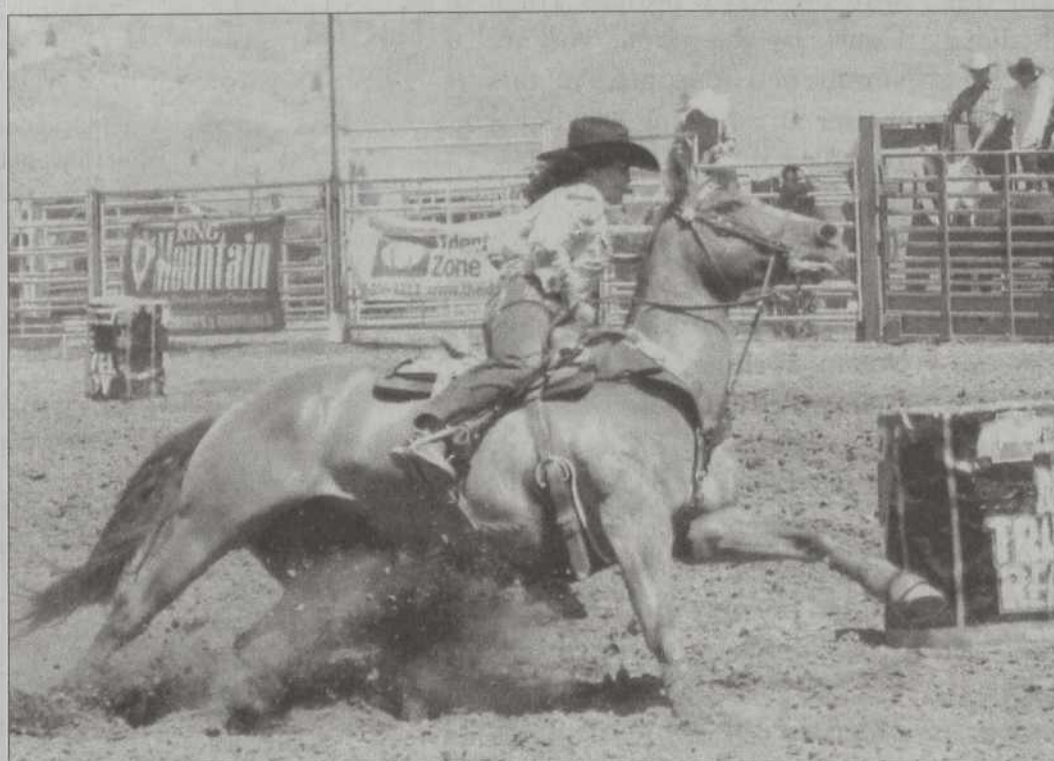
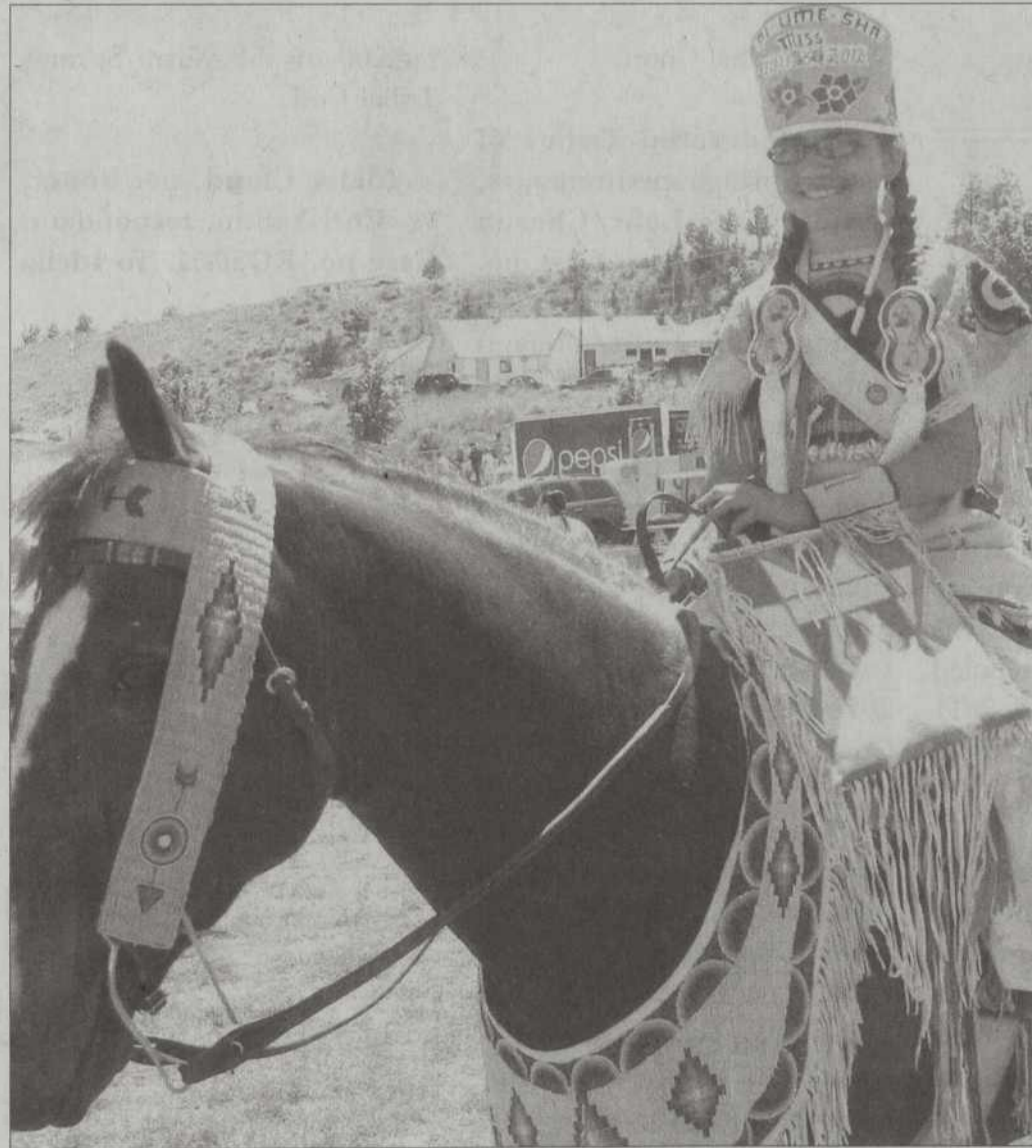


Annalise Whipple (right) was named Miss Pi-Ume-Sha, selling over 4,300 tickets.
