Panel to look at changing Indian royalty oversight

(AP) - Now that a \$3.4 billion settlement has been approved in a lawsuit over past mismanagement of Native American land royalties, a panel is being formed to recommend changes to ensure it doesn't happen again.

The U.S. Department of the Interior is taking nominees to serve on the five-member Commission on Indian Trust Administration and Reform.

Salazar says in a statement that the commission will help evaluate how the department manages and administers its trust responsibilities to American Indians. The commission will have two years to make non-binding recommendations.


