Position Description:

This position is a full-time Administrative and Project Support position. The Intern will work with the Warm Springs Energy Efficiency Green Team to develop a 5-10 year Energy Efficiency Strategic Plan. This plan will include an inventory of tribal facilities energy usage, and include a long term plan with a goal to reduce energy costs of tribal facilities. This will involve compiling data, creating spreadsheets to track energy usage, and working with business and governmental managers and other service providers such as local utility companies, including Wasco Electric and the Oregon Energy Trust. The Intern will submit proposals for energy efficiency incentives to local utilities and will be involved in developing grant proposals. The intern will attend online and other trainings to learn about the energy efficiency field and network with resource providers. The intern will work with the Green Team to develop Energy Efficiency Strategic Plan that will provide guidance for work projects to be completed over the next several years, as well as a plan to ensure the operational self-sufficiency of a Warm Springs Energy Efficiency

program. The Intern may assist with related projects such as acquiring, developing and disseminating energy efficiency education and marketing materials in the community.

Field Work: Intern will work with lighting, weatherization, HVAC and other technicians to learn about energy efficiency audits, meter output readings that measure the amount of energy usage and gain a basic understanding of insulation, lighting and other types of energy efficiency installations to be used.

Limited Duration: This is a one-year limited duration, grant funded position and does not currently have health, retirement or vacation benefits. The intern will work with the Warm Springs Green Team to develop a plan to sustain an Energy Efficiency Program, including funding for a full-time Energy Efficiency staff position

Requirements: Work often involves front line contacts with a variety of organizational staff, and internal and external partner organizations requiring active problem solving and effective interpersonal skills. Some evening and weekend work may be required. Work both in the field and in a professional office environment. Candidate must be proficient in Microsoft Word and Excel and have demonstrated working knowledge of developing and analyzing detailed spreadsheets. Candidate must have reliable transportation, a valid driver's license, and be a motivated self-starter able to complete projects with minimal supervision.
