Abby Scott will be attending New Mexico State University on a basketball scholarship.

Scott, the daughter of James and Amy Scott, will be a senior at Madras High School this fall. The New Mexico State Aggies, in Las Cruces, are part of the Western Athletic Conference.

Abby, a 6-foot-1, averaged 12.2 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 2.6 steals per game as a junior, helping lead her team to a 21-8 record and trip to the class 4A state semifinal round. Abby is the first 2012 commitment for the Aggies and the team's new head coach Mark Trakh.

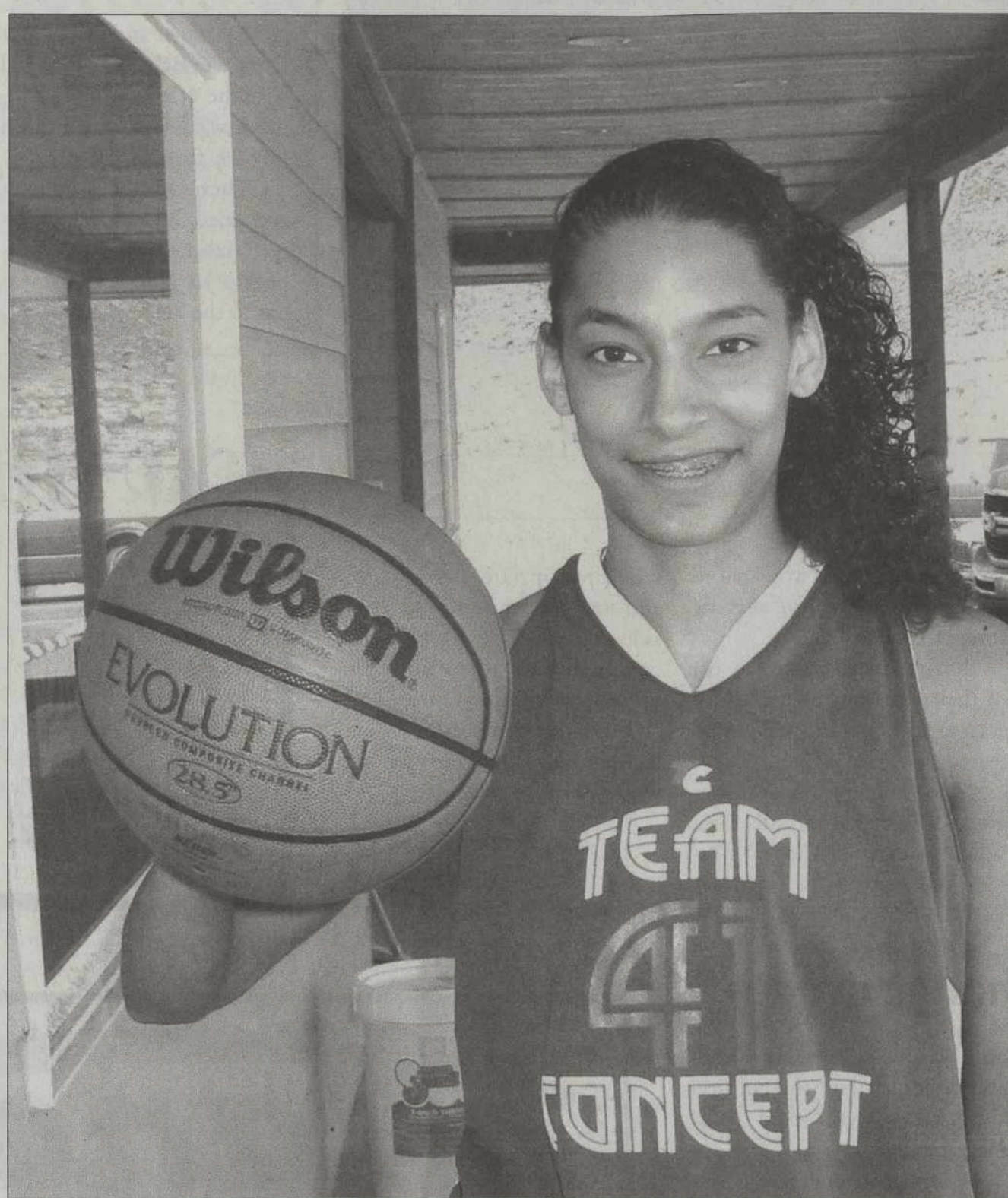
She was actively recruited by several colleges in the country, said Jim Scott. Abby and the family decided New Mexico State is the best choice, he said.

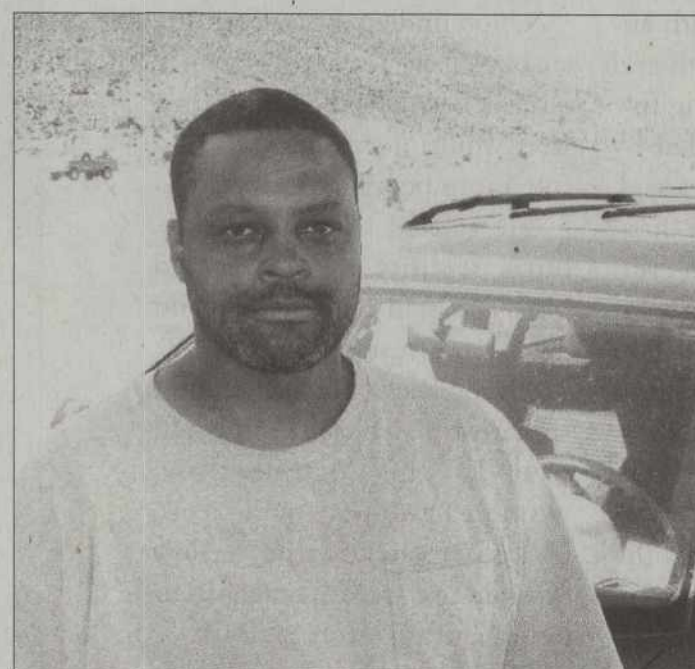
