

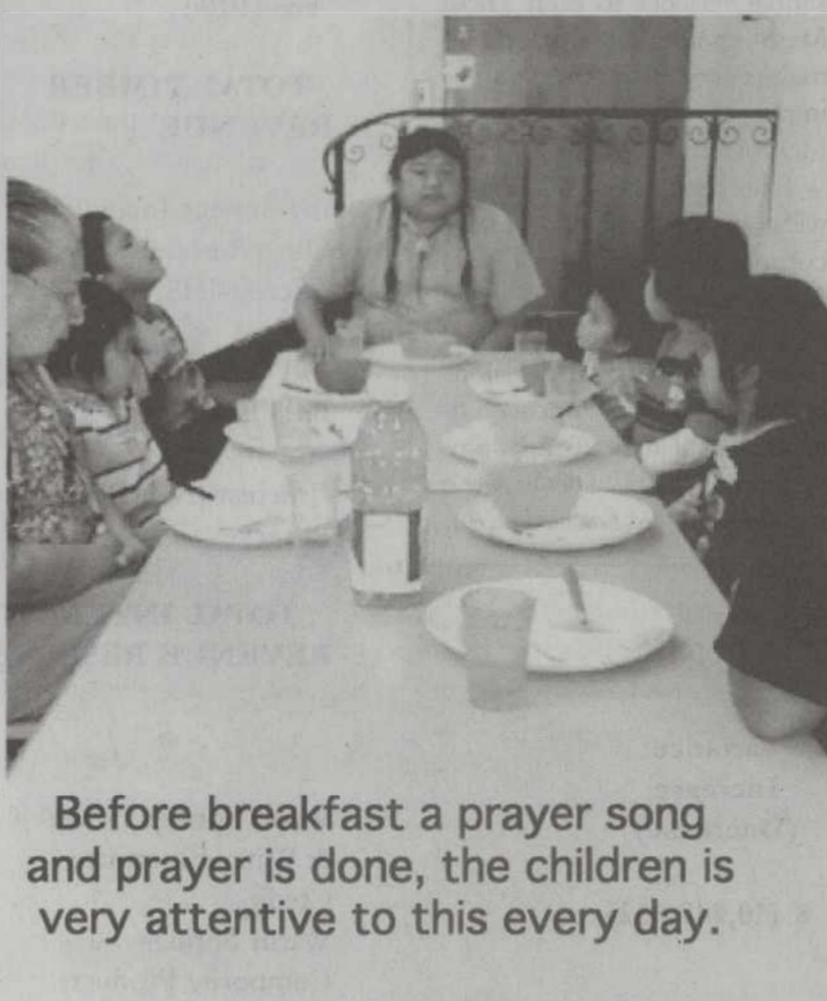

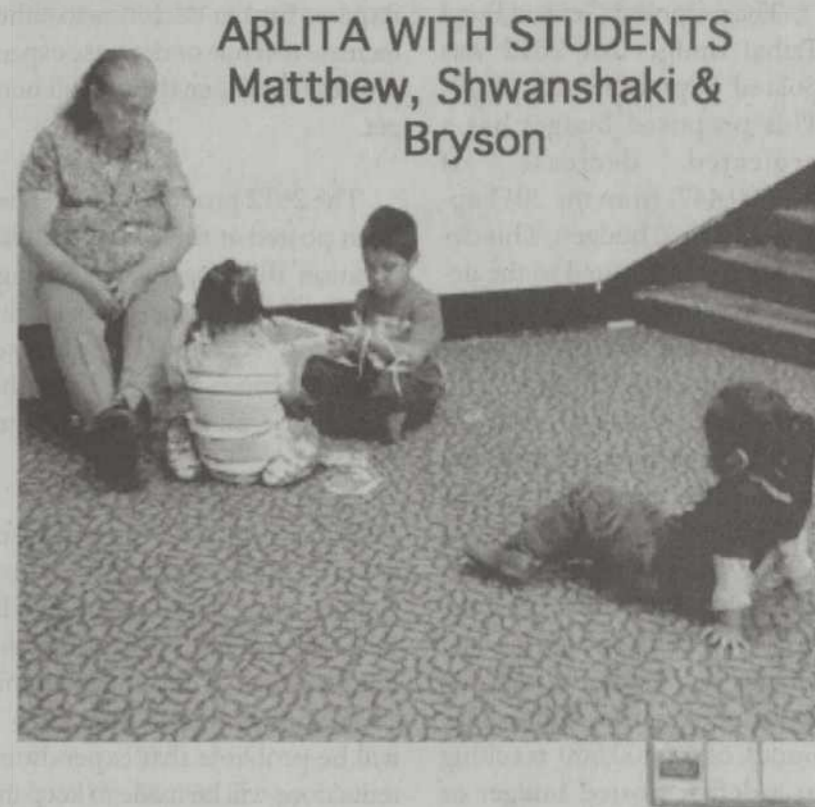
“Autni Ichishkiin Sapsikwat”

Everyday the children learned words, greetings, face parts, clothing, animals, disciplining words, simple commands, food, such as:

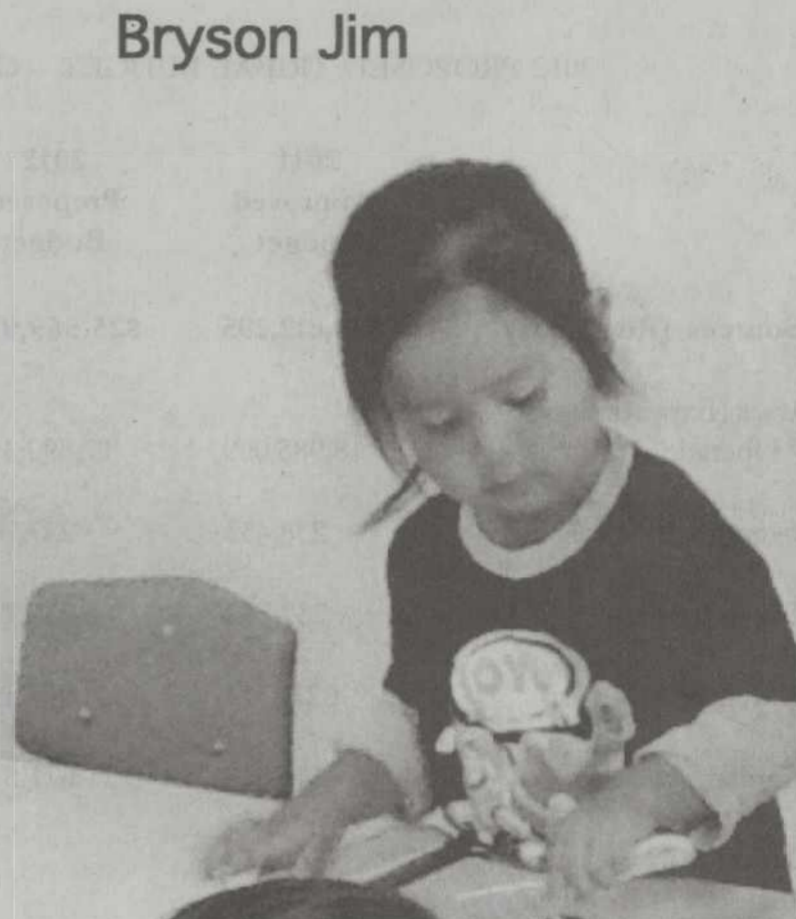
- Niix Maic’qi - Good Morning
 - Chuusha - Drink your water
 - Auna tkwatasha - Time to eat
 - Tkwatak - Eat
 - Pat wanam - Come with me
 - Chaqw’shtitnk kapu - Take off your coat
 - Amash pinaimalakaik k’shtn - Time to brush your teeth
 - Chna aihnk - Sit right here
 - Wusiix aichti - Sit still
 - Acash - Eyes
 - Myshu - Ears
 - Nushnu - Nose
 - Apap - Hand
 - K’shtn - Teeth
 - Walptaikash - Song
- Children songs are sung in the Ichishkiin Language
- Wapiyatak - Wash your hand
 - Pina sapakwstikaik apap - Dry your hand
 - Atauwas - Bathroom
 - Wapaatam - Help me
 - Niixnam ku - Good Job
 - Chu chuu - Quiet/respectful
 - Paiknk - Listen
 - Kapuwik - Put on your coat

Before breakfast a prayer song and prayer is done, the children are very attentive to this every day.



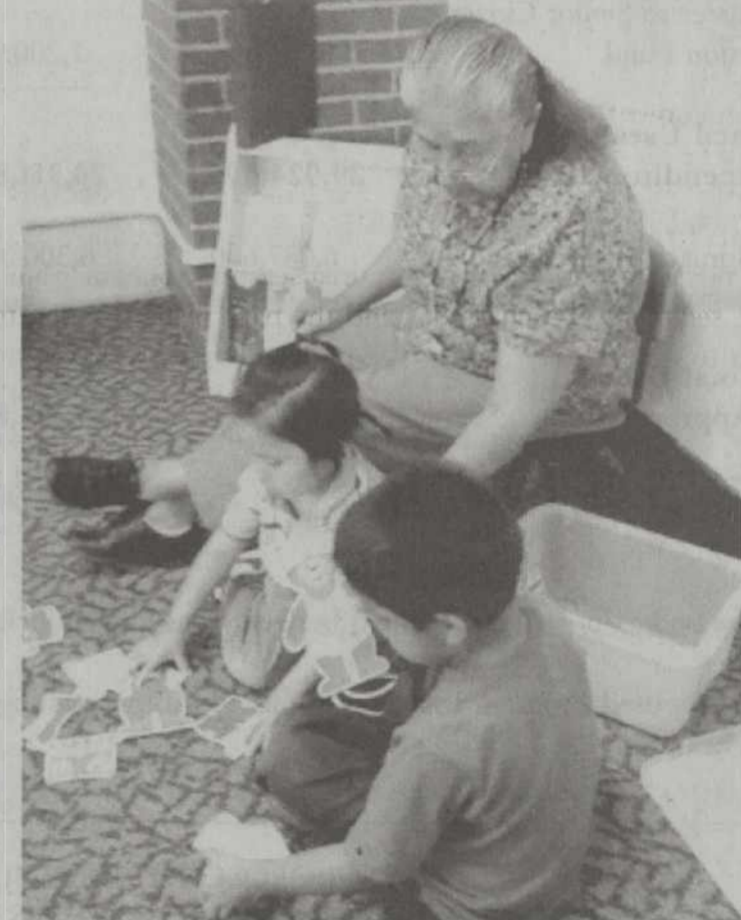

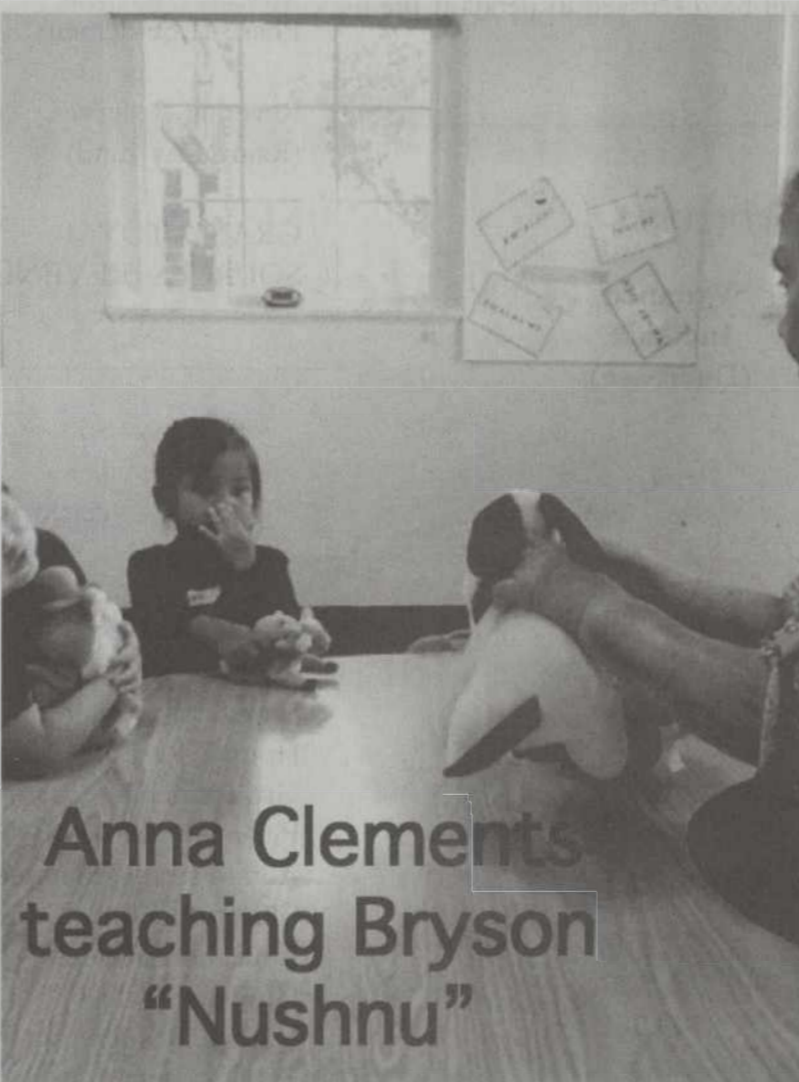

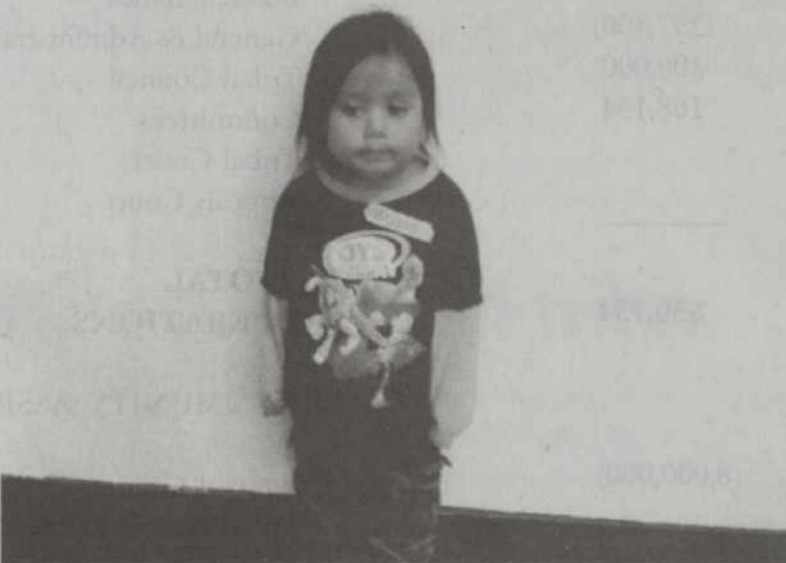
