Warm Springs will host the Outlaw Rodeo this Saturday, Oct. 8, starting at 1 p.m. at the Warm Springs rodeo grounds.

The rodeo will feature a wild horse race, wild colt race (13-17 year olds), junior wild colt race (12 and under), wild cow race (three-man team), cow riding, and bronc riding (saddle and ranch riding).

Heritage center director Peter Booth said the organization wanted to honor the tribe's desire to restore as much of its heritage as possible.

He says the tribe can provide a safe and secure environment for the canoe, so the Willamette Heritage Center can focus on other projects.
