

# - Hunter Survey -

The Natural Resources Branch, and the Fish and Wildlife Committee of the Confederated Tribes rely on hunter surveys in recommending hunting regulations to Tribal Council.

An issue has been a lack of response to the surveys. Regulations adopted by Tribal Council for the 2011 season strongly recommend that hunters complete and return a survey form.

"We rely on the surveys, in conjunction with other data, to estimate populations," said Greg Bjornstrom, wildlife biologist. "And we're trying to get a handle on what has been harvested."

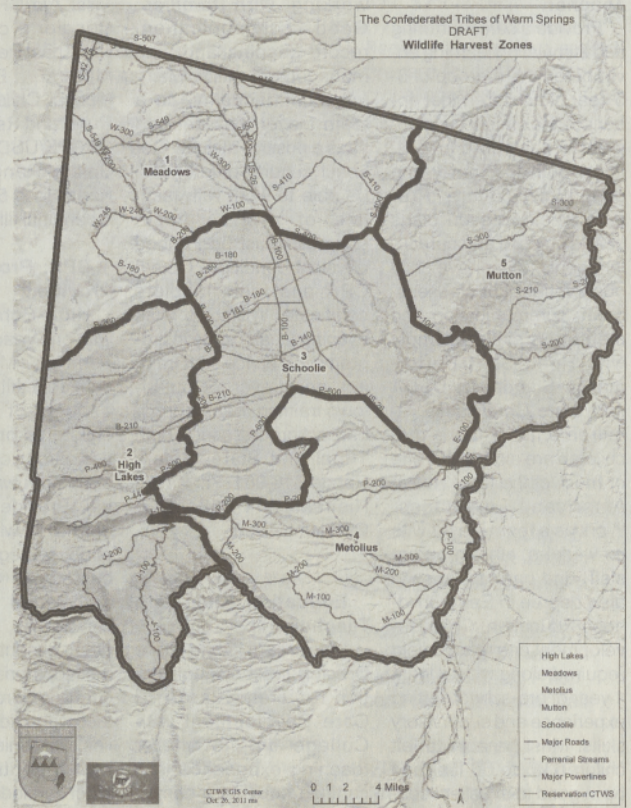
For the 2010 hunting season, the survey response was about 30-40 percent. This year the response has been very low, and Natural Resources and Fish and Wildlife are asking for help from hunters.

At the bottom of the page is a survey that can be returned to the Natural Resources Branch. The maps can be used to assist with the unit and zone designations.
