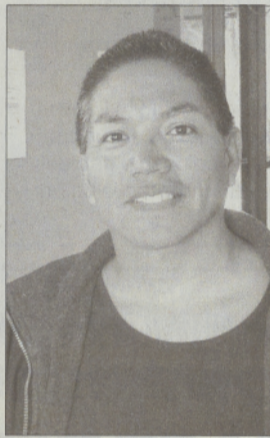

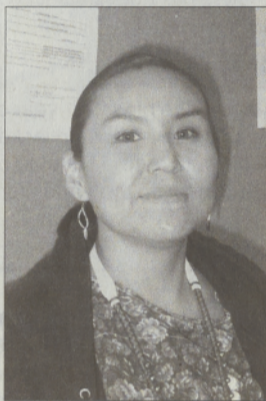

## Overdue library books a growing problem

Libraries are important. They are a great source of learning, a place to find inspiration, empowerment, or another world in which to escape.

You can find books on algebra, starting your own business, and origami. You can find books on diabetes, substance abuse and recovery, pregnancy and depression.

You can find books on Native American history, Indian basketry, and Indian Law. You can find cookbooks, star gazing books, resume and GED books, and children's books. You can find fiction, true crime, Wimpy Kid, and Hunger Games books. You can find all of these and many, many other books at your Warm Springs Community Library. Best of all, it's free to you.

Now imagine you wanted to check some of these books out but you couldn't because they were overdue or never returned. That is an issue your library now faces.

Over 160 library books and items are lost or overdue at this time. Many are several weeks, and in some cases *months*, overdue. Fifty-percent of books checked out right now are overdue or lost. This makes it difficult for library employees who have to make phone calls and send out notices. And in many cases we have no idea when, or if, an overdue book will be returned because people don't respond to the overdue notices.

As a consequence the library has suspended fulfilling book requests and expanding its collection.

Only when the majority of

overdue items are returned or paid for can the library continue to expand its collection and focus on other projects.

In order to get back on track the library requires a reciprocal relationship with you. That means the library provides you with services and items to check out—and in return you take care of your checked out items and return them on time for others to enjoy.

It means letting the library know when you need more time with an item, responding to the library's notices, paying for a book if it gets lost or damaged, etc.

Library staff make every effort to notify people when they have overdue items. But please understand it is your responsibility to know when your items are due.

If you lose an item, if it becomes damaged or stolen, it's your responsibility to contact the library and make arrangements to pay for it. It is also your re-

sponsibility to keep current contact information with the library. If your contact information changes you need to notify the library.

Library staff wish to thank all patrons who have returned their books and paid their fines. Most people do return their library items in good condition and we really appreciate that.

We also wish to thank community members for their generous support in providing subscription donations, volunteer time, and book and magazine donations. We look forward to a bright future with your support and cooperation. Thank you.

Over 160 books are overdue 30 or more days

To encourage the return of Warm Springs Community Library materials we will present, in the next Spilyay, the list of books that are 30 or more days overdue. If you have any overdue books please, *please* return them. These books belong to

everyone and many are difficult to replace. Please return them for the benefit of the community.
