And then last week her game took her to the White House. Schimmel was invited to the White House as part of a five-person panel to discuss Title IX, enacted 40 years ago.

The official topic of discussion was "Inter-generational Views on the Impact of Title IX in Athletics."

The panel featured accomplished and notable athletes and advocates for women in sports, including Schimmel, the stand-out guard for the Cardinals.

Schimmel is also a favorite of Warm Springs, where she has family and many fans.

The panelists who visited the White House ranged in

age and participation level, representing a wide variety of experiences.

Each spoke to Title IX's formative impact on their

lives and offered perspectives and speculations for its future.

The panel was moderated by Bonnie Bernstein, ESPN broadcaster and former All-

American gymnast.

Joining Schimmel on the panel were Billie Jean King, professional tennis player and founder of the Women's Sports Foundation; Aimee Mullins, athlete-advocate and actress; Tom Perez, assistant Attorney General for Civil rights, U.S. Department of Justice; and Laurel J. Richie, president of the WNBA.

In the 2012 season, Schimmel earned postseason honors for the Cardinals, and was named a first team WBCA Region I selection. She earned first team honors after leading the Cardinals in scoring, assists, and steals with 14.3 points, 4.7 assists, and 2.4 steals per game.
