Emshtwit! Itqiuqtdiksh itgadimama kwaba abilaida.
Stand up! Let your elders sit down.

Daminwa amxaludaichgwa ihmiquqtdiksh.
Always greet your elders.

Lgumshxuga itqiuqtdiksh shamani ixelxashat.
Ask your elder if they are thirsty for something to drink.

K'aya amxelpalaulama itqiuqtdiksh ixelxashat.
Never talk back to anyone older than you.

Qadash itkudiix alma amxuxa kwaba.
Behave where ever you are at.

Betxa! K'aya maika idmiqdi
Leave it alone! If it doesn't belong to you.

Ituukdiix engi itkadagwax idelxm anluda qidau dauka alma naika agnuxa.
Treat people he way that you ould like to be treated.

Never talk back to anyone older than you.

Treat each other with respect.

Moomooatupu - Elders
Nonotse - always

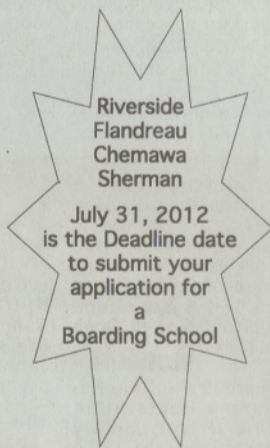
