The Warm Springs canoe and family leave this Thursday, July 12, and return in early August.

The landing at Squaxim Island is set for July 29. This will be followed by Potlatch on the Squaxim Island Reservation, July 29-August 5. *Teachings of Our Ancestors* is a them of this year's journey.
