School supplies list

The first day of school is coming up next week, and the school district 509-J has provided a list of student supplies. Some classes may require additional materials. If so, the student will be notified during the first week of school the teacher. Some school supplies will need to be replenished through the school year. Athletics shoes are needed for all P.E. classes at all schools.

The first day of school is Monday, Sept. 10 for grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 9. The first day of school is Tuesday, Sept. 11 for grades 7, 8, 10, 11 and 12.

All kindergarten, first- and second-grade supplies will be shared. Please do not label supplies with you child's name.

Kindergarten

Two boxes of 15 Crayola crayons (not chubby), 10 pencils size #2, one box of colored pencils, one box washable markers, six glue sticks-large, two large boxes of tissue, one package of baby-wipes (80-150 count).

First and second grades

One box of 16 small crayons, 20 pencils size #2, one eraser, one pair of metal scissors, two 4-ounce bottles of

white glue, three glue sticks-small and solid, two boxes of tissue.

Third grade

One box of 16 or 24 small crayons, pencils size #2, pink pearl erasers, one pair of sharp-point scissors, two glue sticks-small and solid, spiral bound notebook.

Fourth and fifth grades

One box of 16 or 24 small crayons, pencils size #2, pink pearl erasers, one pair of sharp-pointed scissors, two glue sticks-small and solid, one 12-inch ruler (inches and centimeters), one box of tissues, notebook paper, spiral bound notebook.

Sixth grade

Same as fourth and fifth grade plus: Ballpoint pens, blue or black (non-erasable).

Seventh through tenth grades

College ruled notebook paper, one 2-inch, 3-ring (metal ring) bind with dividers.
