

Business loan fund welcoming proposals

The Private Business Revolving Loan Fund of the tribes is accepting business proposals from tribal members.

The Private Business Revolving Loan (PBRL) fund was established by Tribal Council to infuse the local community with private business start-up and expansion capital.

There are four essential parts of a successful application for PBRL funds:

The applicant must be a tribal member. The applicant must also have a complete business plan, complete a loan application, and have a viable concept.

The goal is to have funds accessible to members who

have good business ideas, while ensuring that the fund remains viable into the future, through loan repayments.

Loans of up to \$50,000 are available for business start-ups and existing business expansion or renovation.

The fund has been used recently for a livestock business, said Kahseuss Jackson,

tribal economic development coordinator.

The loan applications are reviewed by a committee that meets one time per month.

Complete business plans can be submitted to Corey Clements. She also has loan applications available.

Calif. governor OKs off-reservation casinos

(AP) — California Gov. Jerry Brown approved casino proposals from two tribes that will allow the facilities to be built miles away from the tribes' reservations.

Brown signed tribal-state gambling compacts for the Enterprise Rancheria of Maidu Indians' proposed casino near the city of Marysville and the North Fork Rancheria's casino in the Central Valley city of Madera.

The compacts come after the U.S. Department of the Interior's approval in September 2011, which granted the tribes a rare exception to the federal law that prohibits gambling on reservations established after 1988.

The law allows the Interior Secretary to make an exception when the off-reservation facility is in the tribe's best interest.

Brown concurred with the federal government, saying the casinos were in the tribes' best interest.
