As well some of the Warm Springs staff in attendance shared a little of the history of Mt. Hood and the Tribes.

The Owner Kirk Hanna offered this building to house information of the Confederated Tribes as it relates to the "Huckleberry Picking Areas" and offered the Tribes unlimited access to the Mountain to gather huckleberries during season.

The trails on the mountain has informational kiosks of plants, trees, etc. they wanted all those listed with Language of all three (3) Tribes, which our Language Instructors completed and shared with Mt. Hood Ski Bowl Staff to display on the trails.

The fee for Vendors is \$25.00 payable at time of set up which will be at 11:00 am. We also will allow limited food vendors and the type of food to be sold, we also require you have a current food handlers card.
