



## Tribe plans \$26M casino in Michigan

MACKINAW CITY, Mich. (AP) – A tribe is planning a new \$26 million casino in Michigan's northern Lower Peninsula.

The Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians

agreed to shift \$970,000 to its capital project fund for pre-construction fees and consulting for a satellite casino in Mackinaw City. A draft of minutes for a recent meeting included the 6-2 vote.

The tribe operates the \$140 million Odawa Casino Resort in Emmet County, south of Petoskey. An agreement with the state of Michigan allows the tribe to build a second casino in Emmet

County. Mackinaw City was originally considered for a casino before the Petoskey-area one was built.

The tribe says the new casino could include 550 slot machines.

Some growers have come and gone, but the work still gets done. In more recent years Edmund Francis, Community Wellness Coordinator, has helped to organize the garden by coordinating with local and outside resources to prep the garden (disc, tilling, planting), holding meetings at the Community Garden, and setting-up and assigning plots

to community members.

Francis has seen similar struggles with water and the irrigation set-up. Over the past five years the garden has had a water break.

Francis says, "The garden is finishing another season providing much produce for community members, and has provided corn four out of six seasons for the Back to School Barbecue."

Although the garden faces challenges—like not having the appropriate equipment

and keeping up with the weed pulling before the weeds reseed—it continues to thrive.

Recently Francis teamed up with OSU Extension for a class at the garden, and participants were able to harvest corn, beans, tomatoes, celery and variety of other vegetable from the garden.

This year Carol Sahme of the Community Wellness Center and youth who participated in the Summer Recreation Program planted and maintained a pumpkin patch

at the garden.

"We would walk to the pumpkin patch to pull weeds," says Sahme. "The kids chose a pumpkin and carved their names in it while it was little, and they have watched it grow."

The garden was created based on the principles of community ownership and sharing and has continued to reap benefits. If you would like more information or want to participate contact Francis at 541-553-2460.

## Tribal vet's cemetery to be built in S.D.

PINE RIDGE, S.D. (AP) – The Department of Veterans Affairs has approved the creation of a new tribal veteran's cemetery on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation with a multimillion grant, the Oglala Sioux Tribe has announced.

The Department of Veterans Affairs is awarding a \$6.5 million grant for the cemetery, which will be located on 63 acres of land about 8 miles east of Kyle.

The grant money will go toward establishing a cemetery entrance, roads, administration building, memorial walkway and burial

areas. The construction will include 260 pre-placed crypts and 40 gravesites.

"As a veteran myself, I am greatly pleased with the Tribe on the positive outcome of this project and it is finally a reality," Oglala Sioux President John Yellow Bird Steele said. "I know many of my fellow veterans will be happy."

Veterans, their spouses and children will be allowed to be buried at the cemetery.

The tribe blessed the land during a ceremony this week. A groundbreaking ceremony is scheduled for Oct. 4.

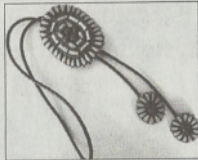
