The clinic will be housed at IHS, and will help in the investigation of child sexual abuse. In the past, children who are victims of the crime of sexual abuse have had to travel to a clinic in Bend for the investigation, including an interview by specialists

and physical examination. The new Warm Springs children's clinic will eliminate the need for the trip to Bend.

Having the clinic located locally will alleviate some of this additional stress to the victim, she said. Caroline Cruz of Health and Human Services, Nancy Seyler, prosecutor, and others have been working on this project for the past few years.
