



Navajo Nation president signs off on tax bill

WINDOW ROCK, Ariz. (AP) – Navajo Nation President Ben Shelly signed off on a bill that boosts the tribe's sales tax by 1 percent.

The increase from 4 percent to 5 percent begins in January and is expected to generate as much as \$8 million a year. That money will

be split between the tribe's scholarship office and an economic development fund. The Tribal Council approved had approved the tax mea-

sure last month. Shelly says the added revenue will help Navajos with scholarships and decrease the tribe's dependence on federal funding

91-year-old Navajo Code Talker to get KU degree

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) – A 91-year-old man from Lawrence, Kan., who was a Navajo Code Talker in World War II will receive his degree next week.

Chester Nez will receive his University of Kansas degree on Monday. He was one of the original 29 Code Talkers in an all-Navajo Marine platoon who created a secret code based on their language used by troops in World War II.

Nez had to leave the university in 1952 after three years because his GI Bill funds ran out. No one at the time knew he was a Code Talker.

The Lawrence Journal-World reports (<http://bit.ly/Z596tO>) Kansas First Lady Mary Brownback will attend the ceremony. Nez also will receive gifts from the city of Lawrence, the KU Alumni Association, Haskell Indian Nations University and the Native Faculty and Staff Council at Kansas.

Feds detail takeover of ND tribe's programs

FARGO, N.D. (AP) – The federal Bureau of Indian Affairs said it has handled more than a hundred reports of suspected child abuse or neglect on the Spirit Lake reservation since taking over social services in October.

The bureau assumed control of the tribe's social service programs after criticism that the tribe has failed to protect vulnerable children.

The bureau has new procedures for placing children in foster homes, including ensuring there are documents showing the placement was ordered by a tribal judge.

The bureau also informed the North Dakota congressional delegation last week that it has hired a social worker to manage the Spirit Lake Tribe's social services program.

"It's important that the BIA continue to be engaged,

and that they keep the public informed about efforts to ensure child safety on the reservation," delegation members said in a statement.

Last week, some members of the Spirit Lake Tribe complained that visible progress was not being made.

Protesters gathered outside tribal headquarters before a general assembly called by the tribal council, holding signs with messages such as, "Who is looking out for the

kids of Spirit Lake?" and "Justice for the victims of abuse."

"I'm not seeing any progress," Theresa Brien, a tribal member who lives in Grand Forks, said in a phone interview while picketing on Nov. 5. "They're not letting people know what they're doing. They're basically blowing smoke. We have a right to know what they're doing."
