

W.S. saw big turnout on election day

Four-hundred and seventy voters in Jefferson County precinct 14, which includes most of the Warm Springs Reservation, cast ballots in the November 6 general election.

Tribal voters went strongly for Pres. Obama, who received 399 of the local votes, to Gov. Romney's 57.

The Warm Springs precinct supported Joyce Segers, Democrat, for U.S. Representative. She received 261 local votes, to Republican Rep. Greg Walden's 185. Walden won re-election by an overall vote of 5,448 to 2,187.

On a local measure, Precinct 14 supported the Madras Aquatic Center operation levy. The rest of the county rejected the proposal, which failed by 350 votes.

The state measures regarding private casinos—measures 82 and 83—were soundly rejected by reservation voters. The Precinct 14 vote on Measure 82 (allowing private casinos) was 438 against and 30 in favor.

Measure 83 (allowing Wood Village casino) was 438 against and 28 in favor. Both gaming measures also failed county-wide and statewide.

Measure 85 asked whether the state could use the corporate kicker to fund k-12 education. Precinct 14

strongly favored this measure by a vote of 315-127. The rest of the county narrowly voted against the proposal: 3,949 to 3,697. Measure 85 passed statewide by a good margin.

Measure 80, asking whether to legalize marijuana,

was rejected in Precinct 14, county-wide and statewide.

Precinct 14 supported Kate Brown for Secretary of State, with 358 votes to Knute Buehler's 72. Jefferson County overall supported Buehler. Brown won statewide.

The Warm Springs precinct supported Ted Wheeler for state Treasurer. The county overall supported his opponent, Tom Cox. Wheeler won re-election.

For Oregon Attorney General, Precinct 14 supported Ellen Rosenblume, who received 370 reservation votes to James Buchal's 50 votes. The county overall supported Buchal. Rosenblume won the statewide vote.

State Sen. Ted Ferrioli received 300 votes in Precinct 14. He ran unopposed and was re-elected.

The Warm Springs precinct supported Gary Ollerenshaw for state representative. The county overall supported Rep. John Huffman, who won re-election.
