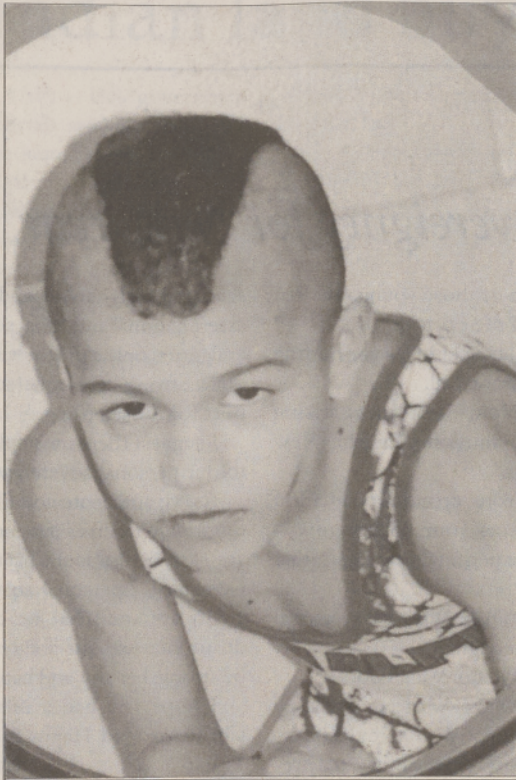


Wrestling champs

TFT Boxing traveled to Spokane recently for the Dan Vassar Memorial Boxing tournament.

The first bout in the 10-year-old 80-pound division Kywon took a match bout with fellow Native American fighter Skyler Red Deer-Eagle from Montana. Skyler is a Boxer with the Flathead Boxing Club of Kalispell, Mont.

In the first round of the match Kywon set up the right hand and knocked the mouth-

piece of Skyler out twice.

When the match continued Kywon boxed with slick defensive style, and outscored Skyler for the entire round.

In the second round Kywon jabbed Skyler into the ropes and threw a combination which resulted in Skyler reviving a standing 8 count. During the count, Skyler shook his head to the referee signaling "no more" and the referee waved off the fight. Kywon was victorious by RSC

In the second bout, in the 8-year old 65-pound division, LeBron matched with Damian Cervantes with Round 3 Boxing of Granger, Wash.

LeBron and Damian met as 6-year-olds at several different tournaments. They were anticipating their first bout when they turned 8. They finally got the match, and it was a toe-to toe fight from the beginning bell.

The first round was given to Damian for landing more punches, and he showed more aggression. In the second round LeBron was instructed to "beat him to the punch and back him up."

LeBron followed the instructions, jabbing Damian into the ropes. Damian began to show fatigue at the middle of each round and LeBron won rounds 2 and 3 for a victory.
