The Louisville Cardinals women's basketball team is heading into March Madness as the tenth-ranked team in the NCAA standings.

Jude and Shoni Schimmel are having outstanding seasons. Earlier this month, junior guard Shoni was named Big East Player of the Week.

During that week, she led the Cardinals to a narrow win over South Florida. She scored a career-high 38 points and tied the school record with eight made 3-pointers.

For the season Shoni is averaging 29.6 points per game, most on the team. She's average 14 assists per game, also
