

Claim vehicles from impound lot by June 21

The Warm Springs Police Department is informing all tribal members that all unclaimed vehicles at the impound lot are going to be processed, leaned and sold.

If you have a vehicle at the lot, you have until June 21 to make contact with the police department, and arrange to make payments to retrieve your vehicle.

The payment must be in full with a money order for the sum of \$225, payable to the Warm Springs Police Department. The payment is to cover the tow bill, which otherwise is charged to the police department budget.

You must retrieve your vehicle by 4 p.m. on June 21. You will need to have proof of ownership to get any vehicle out of the im-

ound lot. Getting the vehicle removed from the lot is the responsibility of the vehicle owner.

To anyone retrieving a vehicle from the lot: You will need licensed driver, if the vehicle is drivable.

If you have a vehicle in

the impound lot because of probate, please get with the Probate Department and have them make arrangements to have the vehicle moved to Probate's lot.

Any vehicles left after June 21 will be leaned and sold. They will be sold out

of the Central Oregon area.

If you have a vehicle that has been seized, or to ensure your appearance in tribal, state or federal court, please go see Prosecution and bring a judgment order releasing your vehicle. Keep in mind, just because your vehicle has

been released, you are still responsible for the tow fee which has been set at the flat rate of \$225 per vehicle. If you have any questions, feel free to stop by the Warm Springs Police Department, 2144 Kota St.
