Artwork by Ko-Na Foster J. Kalama are being featured in Central Oregon Community College building in Madras. Kalama was chosen by COCC to fill two out of four available positions for art.

The works by Foster chosen by COCC are *River-Land-Air*, and *Powwow Trail*.

Kalama was one of over 100 Central Oregon artists who submitted work for judging.

He is also co-founder and committee member for

the recently established 501(c)3 non-profit organization called the Education Improvement Network, which supports education reform and supplies much needed cultural support for Central Oregon youth.

The support includes buying musical instruments for kids, providing stipends for tribal and Hispanic elders to teach culture and heritage, producing literary publications, and providing student educational scholarships.
