The following are from the website summary of *Enduring Spirit*:

The second volume in the Northwest Photography Series will tell the story of the first 50 years of photography of Native Americans of Oregon and Washington.

Through studio and candid portraits, views of Native settlements, and photo-documentation of Native customs and practices, these images reveal the ways in which early photographers reacted to and interpreted their encounters with the indigenous populations, as well as how those interpretations changed as Euro-Americans settled throughout the Northwest.

Likewise, they reveal

the ways in which Native peoples adapted and survived in the face of extreme challenges forced upon them from the mid-nineteenth century through the early twentieth.

Enduring Spirit begins in 1857, when U.S. Army lieutenant Lorenzo Lorain ar-

rived at Fort Umpqua near the Siletz Indian Reservation in the Oregon Territory and began to photograph the Indians who had recently been removed there. These rare salt-print portraits, now in the collection of the Oregon Historical Society, are the earliest known photographs of Oregon Indians, perhaps the earliest of any Native group in the Northwest...

In Oregon and Washington, as elsewhere in the western United States, Euro-American photographers used their cameras to "capture" the Native peoples, and to make sense of their otherness for white audiences. Surprisingly, however, very little scholarship has paid attention to early photography of American Indians in the Northwest. *Enduring Spirit* will be the first book to draw together diverse, previously unpublished, historic photographs of Pacific Northwest Native Americans from both public and private archival collections throughout Oregon and Washington.
