

IHS regional team visits Warm Springs

The Indian Health Services regional team met with Tribal Council last week. One item on the agenda was the future of five IHS housing units located around the campus area.

IHS is planning to list the units as excess property,

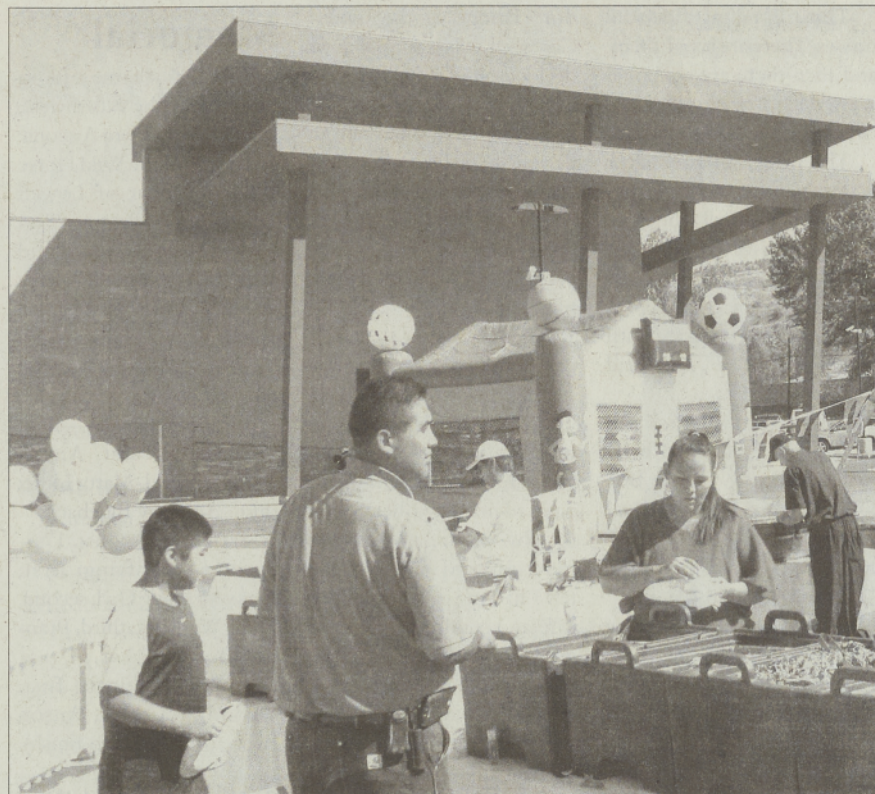
which are no longer needed of IHS staff. There are two options regarding the units:

Demolition of the units, which would cost about \$62,000 per unit. Indian Health Services would pay the cost of the abatement and demolition.

Another option would be for IHS transfer the units to tribal ownership for renovation. Renovation would cost an estimated \$201,000 per unit. There is, for instance, asbestos in the buildings that would have to be removed. The tribes would have to pay

the cost of renovation.

The regional office informed Tribal Council that IHS would issue a letter stating the availability of the units. If the regional office receives no response, then IHS will proceed with demolition.
