

Memorable opening game for MHS tailback

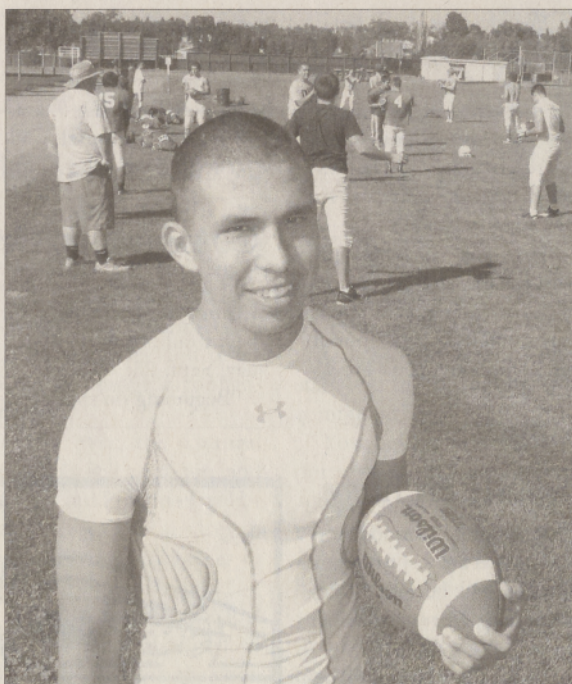
Jered Pichette scored three touchdowns and ran for 238 yards in the first game of season for Madras High School. They were playing away at Stayton, and won the game 20-21.

Pichette was a leading high school rusher in the state that week, earning recognition from MaxPreps.com.

The 238 yards were the most by far that MHS Coach Rick Wells has seen in his five years with the program. "That was one of the best games anyone had in the state that week," Wells said.

Pichette is a junior at Madras High School. He also plays basketball. His parents are Adeva and Jason Pichette.

Jered stayed in shape during the summer by working outdoors, and then practiced

Hunting season update from Natural Resources

Please come by the Natural Resources office to pick up your tags, a state lands 2013 Big Game Regulations Guide, and to sign up for lottery hunts.

Tags will be issued on a first come first serve basis. You may pick up your tag up to two days before the start of the hunt.

Due to the 2013 cost containment directive, the Natural Resources office will be closed Friday, September 27, Friday, October 11, and Friday October 25 for reduced work hours.

Tags for hunts starting the following Saturday's may be picked up the Wednesday and Thursday before.

2013 reservation hunting

Deer season: September 28 – October 31:

Legal weapons: Rifle, muzzleloader, shotgun with slugs only, and archery (greater than 40# draw).

Bag limit: One buck deer having not less than a forked antler, per family.

Elk season: November 2 – November 30:

Legal weapons: Rifle, muzzleloader, and archery (greater than 50# draw).

Bag limit: One elk per family (Nov 2 - 17).

Bag Limit: One antlered elk per family (Nov 18 – 30).

Bear season: Fall: September 21 – November 30:

Spring: April 15 – May 31, 2014

Legal weapons: Rifle, muzzleloader, and archery.

Bag Limit: One bear per month per family, except cubs and sows with cubs are protected.

Cougar season: September 21, 2013 – March 30, 2014:

Legal weapons: Rifle, muzzleloader, and archery. Hunting cougars with dogs is permitted for tribal members only (Exception: For the assistance of Natural Resource staff dealing with problem lions or conducting research).

Bag limit: One cougar per month per family. It is unlawful to take spotted kittens or female cougars with spotted kittens.

Big horn sheep season: October 19, 2013 – November 10, 2013:

Legal weapons: Rifle, muzzleloader, and archery.

Bag limit: One big horn

sheep ram. One tag will be issued to one tribal member through lottery draw on September 26, 2013.

Upland birds

Grouse - 3 per day - September 21 - November 30.

Quail - 10 per day - September 21, 2013 - January 31, 2014.

Pheasant - Closed.

Chukar - 10 per day - September 21, 2013 - January 31, 2014.

Turkey - 2 per month - September 21 - November 30.

Migratory bird

Mourning Dove - Wasco/Jefferson counties - 9/1-9/30 - 10/30.

Ducks - Wasco - 10/12 - 10/20 & 10/23/2013 - 1/26/2014 7* 21*

Ducks - Jefferson - 10/5 - 12/1/2013 & 12/4/2013 - 1/19/2014 7* 21*

Goose - Wasco/Jefferson - 10/12 - 10/20/2013 & 10/28/2013 - 1/26/2014 - 4 dark, 6 white 12 dark, 18 white

Ceded Land Hunting

Ceded Land Hunting Tags must follow ODFW regulations. Reference the hunt number (ex. WS 438) in the ODFW Big Game Regulations Guide Book for detailed hunt boundary descriptions.

It is the hunter's responsibility to know where they are hunting, where they are allowed to hunt, what weapons they are allowed to use and what the bag limit is.

Ceded Land Hunting is designated for public (unclaimed) lands, private land hunting access must be approved by landowners. ODFW hunt regulations may also be found online at:
