## USDA funding in place for k-8

The Confederated Tribes received final loan confirmation last week from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The loan is for the construction of the Warm Springs k-8 school.

Work began on the school in July. The tribes and school district have been paying for this work, mainly the site preparation, with funding on hand.

The USDA final approval means the tribes can now secure financing through a lending institution. Receipt of the final approval had been anticipated, which is why the construction was able to begin in July.

Still, the final USDA approval was welcome news to Finance at both the tribes and school district.

Meanwhile, the first concrete pour happened last

week at the k-8 construction site. The goal is for the floor slabs poured by the end of October, said Dave Fischel, of the Wenaha Group, project manager.

The mason work is scheduled to start in a couple of weeks, Fischel said. The walls

of the new gymnasium will be the first ones to go up.

The Warm Springs k-8 school is on schedule to open in the fall of next year. Attendance is expected to include over 720 students. The \$20 million school is located on Tenino at Chukar.
