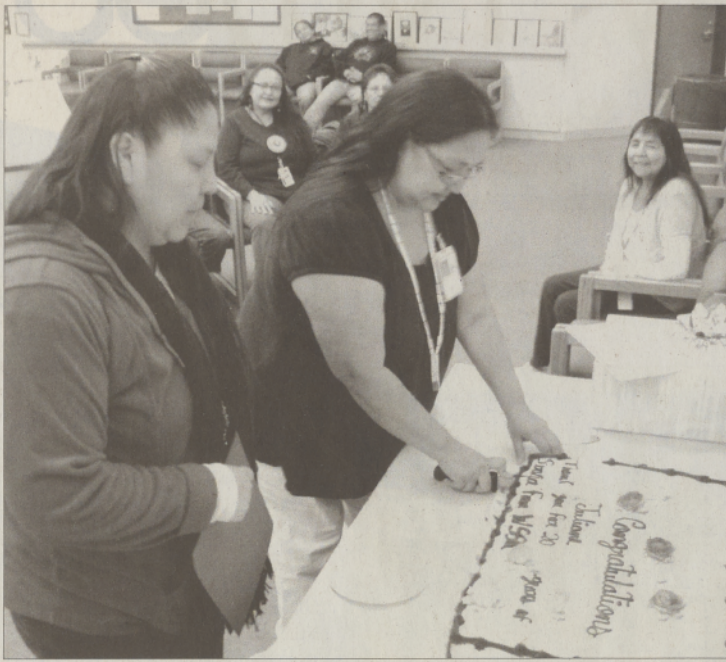


For 20 Years of Service

velop potential new approaches.

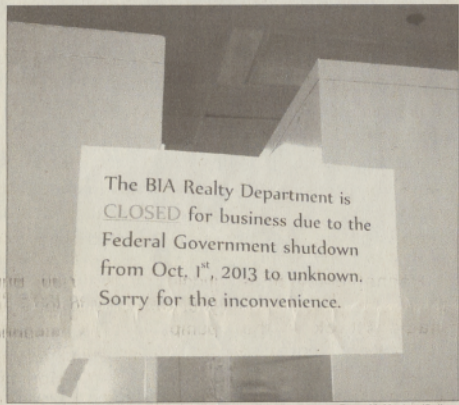
The story-telling sessions will focus on elders of the reservation, but health advocates and service providers and recipients may also participate.

Federal Shutdown



Seventeen employees of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, based on the reservation, were off the job since the federal government shutdown. The per capita checks were also delayed in October, due to the shutdown. BIA Warm Springs Agency Superintendent John Halliday was on the job, though not receiving pay, as the superintendent must be on hand in case of emergency. One inconvenience of the shutdown happened at the jail, a BIA facility. A boiler at the jail was down with no employee to restart the equipment, leaving the inmates in the cold. The problem was eventually addressed.
