Archaeologist Tom Connolly, director of research at the University of Oregon's Museum of Natural and Cultural History, and State Museum of Anthropology, will present "The Sandals That Changed the World."

His talk will describe how

the archaeological record supports the most accepted current theory that the First Americans arrived in North America via a resource-rich offshore route from northern Asia called the "Kelp Highway." It is free and open to the public.
