

Solar project taking shape by Credit

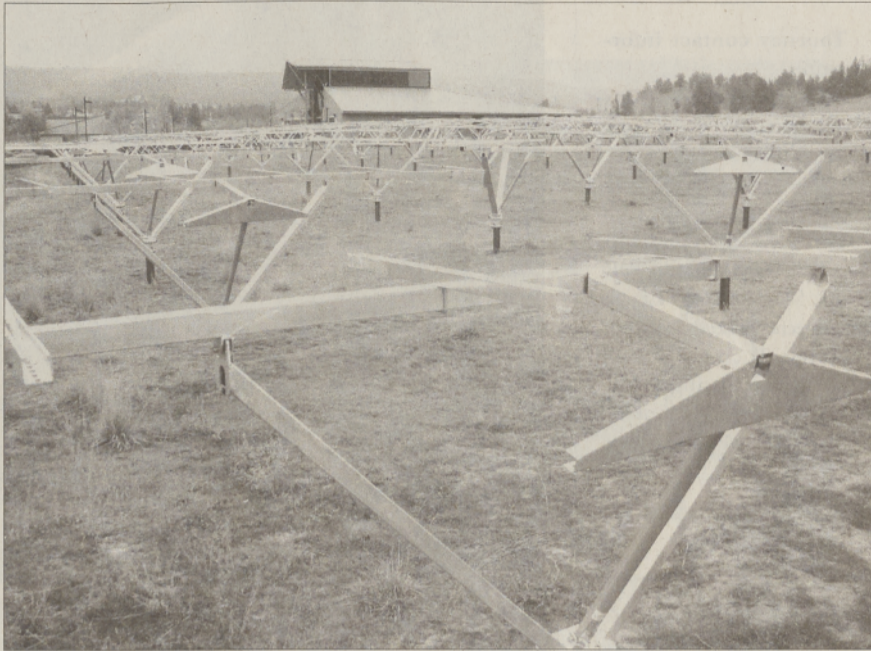
The framework is up for the solar panels that will be located next to the Credit Enterprise building.

The project is being developed by PGPV, based in Albany.

The tribes are leasing the site to the company. Solar energy from the cells will be used to power the tribal administration building.

This will be a unique system in the region. The solar panels will be moved during the day by a robotic device.

The movement will keep the cells in optimum line with the sun. When the lease is up on the property, the system will be turned over to the tribes.

(Jake Frank traveled to Europe this past summer, as an ambassador with the People to People program. He kept a journal during the trip, and wishes to share some of the highlights.)

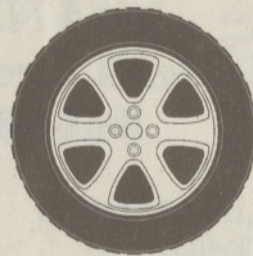
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
