Thank you hunters for harvest reporting

Thank you for all the participation in the 2013 hunting season. It was a very successful year!

The wildlife department would like to remind hunters to report their hunting results as soon as possible.

Please completely fill out the questionnaire on the right side of the tag and return it to the natural resource department office.

Hunters may also call in reporting information to the natural resource department front desk at 541-553-2001.

Failure to report harvest results for the ceded land and reservation hunts will result in a loss of hunting privileges for subsequent tags.

Please be honest with your hunter reporting. If you have been issued a tag, you have the right to harvest an animal.

Harvest and hunting information is important for the wildlife department

in helping to determine wildlife population sizes, herd compositions and hunting pressure.

In addition, this information helps us determine where there are and are not animals. This assists us in our habitat restoration efforts.

Your continued support and participation with hunter reporting is greatly appreciated.

Tags available

There are still a limited number of ceded area hunting tags that are available through February.

Tags will be issued at the natural resource department front desk. Please help protect the tribes wildlife resources by reporting poaching violations to our poaching hotline at 541-553-8300.
