## 'Young at Art' opening at museum

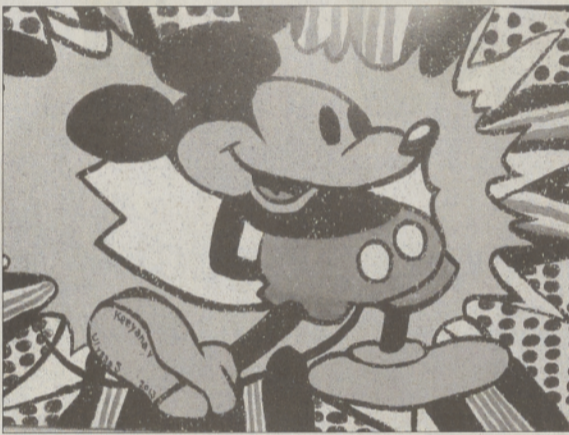
The Tribal Youth Art Show at the Museum at Warm Springs opens this Thursday, Jan. 23.
