

Resolution of Tribal Council

Whereas the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon is a federally recognize Indian tribe; and

Whereas Warm Springs Forest Products Industries is a wholly owned business enterprise of the tribe, formed in 1966 pursuant to tribal referendum under section 12 of the tribe's corporate charter; and

Whereas by Resolution 11,289, Tribal Council established the Business Investment Revolving Fund (BIRF) Committee whose purpose is

to utilize Tribal Council appropriated funds and other available funds to assist with the development of business opportunities by tribal business enterprises on the Warm Springs Reservation; and

Whereas, sawmill operational working capital and capital investment is needed and critical for the tribe to continue sawmill operations and be competitive in the local, regional, national and global economy and are therefore critical for the current and future welfare of the tribe; and

Whereas a tribal investment is necessary to enable WSFPI to continue to expeditiously implement planned sawmill operations; and

Whereas the BIRF committee has met and reviewed the status of the WSFPI project, an up to date WSFPI business plan and financials, and a request from WSFPI for funding in the amount of \$500,000 as a loan agreement; and

Whereas the BIRF committee believes that the additional \$500,000 contribution in WSFPI is consistent with

the BIRF operating principles and recommends that the Tribal Council grant WSFPI's funding request out of BIRF funds; now therefore

Be it resolved by the Twenty-Sixth Tribal Council of the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon, pursuant to Article V, Section 1(f), (l) and (t) of the Tribal Constitution and By-Laws, that the Tribal Council hereby loans, directs and authorizes the Tribal Council chair, Vice Chair, and/or Secretary Treasurer/CEO to develop and

execute a loan agreement for an Investment in a manner consistent with the BIRF committee recommendations, and further directs that any interest and earnings on such funding shall be reinvested in the BIRF fund; and

Be it further resolved that the Tribal Council hereby authorizes the Secretary-Treasurer/CEO to provide funding to WSFPI from the BIRF fund in the total amount of \$500,000 in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions recommended by the BIRF committee and to

execute any funding documents consistent with the same, and directs that any interest and earnings on such funding shall be reinvested in the BIRF fund; and

Be it further resolved that the Tribal Council hereby ratifies any and all actions taken by the Tribal Council Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary-Treasurer/CEO that are consistent with the approvals and authorizations in the above resolutions.

Clinical Psychologist
