

# Rare feat from 3-point range

Abby Scott achieved a rare feat in January, tying an all-time NCAA Division I Women's basketball record.

The New Mexico State Aggies were playing Chicago State. Abby, a 6-1 sophomore, plays guard for the Aggies.

In the opening minutes of the home game against Chicago State, Abby hit a long 3-point shot, which proved to be the first of many.

By the end of the evening she had made eleven 3-pointers, scoring 36 points—breaking the school record and the Western Athletic Conference record.

This also tied the NCAA Division I Women's record.

Abby is a 2011 graduate of Madras High School. Her father is James Scott.

For the 2013-14 season, through last week, Scott was averaging 26.3 minutes per game, third most on the team.

She also had the second-most points on the team, and third-best scoring average. She had 18 steals and ten blocks.

Upcoming games for the Aggies include Texas Pan

American on Feb. 20; Utah Valley on February 27; and California State University Bakersfield on Saturday, March 1.

# Schimmel having great senior year

Shoni Schimmel is having another great year with the Louisville Cardinals. The team is currently ranked no. 3 in the nation. Their only recent loss came against Connecticut, the no. 1 team in the country. Louisville plays a rematch against Connecticut on March 3.

Shoni, 5-9 guard, is a senior this year. Mock drafts have her as a first-round pick in the WNBA.

Meanwhile, her dominating performance at Louisville continues to impress. She set the school record for 3-point shots in a recent game against Memphis, hitting 9 or 12. The school record she broke was her own, set the previous year.

In late January she was the ESPN National Player

of the Week. And she is on the Naismith Trophy Midseason 30 list. This trophy will go to the NCAA women's player of the year. She was the only Louisville player to make the list.

Schimmel, originally from Mission, was averaging 17.6 points per game, hitting 39.6 percent of her 3-point shots

and making 81.5 percent of her free throws—all team highs.

She is in contention for the Wooden Award, the other player of the year recognition in college basketball. Louisville plays this evening, Feb. 19, against Houston; and on Feb. 23 against Rutgers.
