She earned her undergraduate degree in Environmental Studies at Lewis and Clark College in 2009.

as valedictorian. She then went on to college and law school, marking some other notable accomplishments:

She was a recipient of the Oregon State Bar Association award for Diversity and Inclusion.

From 2006-2008 Ms. Bodine served as President of the Native American Student Union at Lewis and Clark College.

She worked as an intern with the Columbia River Intertribal Fish Commission. Ms. Bodine was a notable contributor and project lead at Oregon Health Sciences University, researching toxicology issues for Native Americans and consumption of contaminated salmon.

She is a former Udall Congressional intern, and has received numerous awards, scholarships and accolades for her work in Indian country.

The fellowship

Each year a Hatfield Fellow works with a member of the Oregon Congressional delegation. The goal is to enhance the mutual understanding between leadership in Washington, D.C., and Indian Country. The Spirit Mountain Community Fund is sponsor of the program. The Hatfield Fellowship was created in 1998 to honor Senator Mark O. Hatfield's public service to Oregon and the Pacific Northwest.
